SESSION SYNOPSIS OF MARCH 15, 2023

Session's March Meeting was held just a few days after the all-congregation Mission/Vision meeting on March 11 at which all session members were present. The positives from that meeting dealing with the future direction for FPCV were evident. It was acknowledged there is work to be done by session in reviewing the outcomes of that Mission/Vision event and making some decisions of actions and priorities for the work of this congregation going forward. Reflections offered regarding that event included: interesting, meaningful, hopeful, encouraging, active, helpful, enlightening, positive groundwork, what's next?, surprising, informing, uninformed, a connecting foundation.

The Elders participated in the education portion of the meeting which involved reading and discussing the *Scots Confession*, from the Book of Confessions which contains the Confessions important to the Presbyterian Church USA.

As is customary, the elders were in prayer for the wider community and then reflected on some of information provided them by the elder commissioners who attended the Presbytery of Wabash Valley Assembly on Saturday, February 5th. Some proposed changes to the Book of Order that is used by all PCUSA churches were approved at Assembly. Pastor Kim delivered a Homily and she along with Rev. Lucia Hutchinson hosted a Q & A regarding peace, justice and gun violence during Assembly.

ITEMS OF INFORMATION:

- Finance will be engaging a local accounting firm (TBD) to conduct an audit of the church's finances, something not done in the past few years but that is a good practice for our church or any church.
- > There will be Confirmation Banquet May 21, a church-wide Potluck following worship.
- Summer Worship Schedule will be forthcoming from the Worship Team setting forth the Sundays for indoor worship and worship in the Pavilion.
- Each ministry team had been asked to add one or more new members to their teams ...and the teams have been very successful in doing that. Stewardship added 1, Personnel added 1, Congregational Life and its sub committees of funeral and garden ministries added 4 & 3 respectively, Finance now has 12 total, i-Engage working on 1 to commit, Faith Formation added 1, Worship added 1 and by April Session meeting, Membership, Mission and B & G are asked to have a new member added. (*If approached, it is hoped our members will be open to being part of one or more of our ministry teams as it is the teams that do the work of this congregation.*)
- The Ministry Teams are taking turns in presenting what they do as part of the Church at Work moment on Sundays before worship to share with the congregation exactly what each team is doing in the life our church.
- Faith Formation & Personnel Teams continue considering candidates for our part-time Faith Formation lead position to take on that portion of Pastor Ken's former role in Faith Formation.

Reports from all the Teams were received and approved.

Finance Motions/Action Items

- The Finance Team and the Planned Giving Committee recommended taking the full available \$12,429 Endowment distribution from the Porter County Community Foundation Endowment Fund (already included in our 2023 budget).
- The Finance Teams to approve revisions to 2023 budget based upon Endowment and bequest distributions.
- Per the Session-approved Gift Policy, the Finance Team recommended acceptance of an anonymous gift of stock from a small, closely held corporation.
- Historically, annual scholarship recipients have been chosen by a scholarship team. The Finance Team recommended Session approve last year's team of Karen Huguenard, Jason Gordon, Connie Knauff, Doug Hollar and Cathy Greenawald (if each is willing) serve this year, and as a taskforce in consultation with one of the pastors to recommend to the Finance Team any revisions to Policies F5 (First Presbyterian Church Service Award), F6 (Anne Lauterbach Scholarship), F7 (Scholarship Committee) in the Session Policies Of The First Presbyterian Church, October 3, 2021

Slavery in the North (Equal Justice Initiative)

Slavery in New England began in the 1630's, when European colonizers enslaved more than 1,500 Pequot men, women, and children in Massachusetts, Rhode Island, and Connecticut.

When famine and disease ravaged Indigenous populations, Europeans kidnapped people from Africa and trafficked them to the colonies where they were subjected to extreme violence and brutality. In 1641, Massachusetts became the first Northern colony to formally legalize slavery.

The Transatlantic Slave Trade soon became a massive international enterprise; and colonies in New England played a critical role. Between 1678 and 1807, at least 314 trafficking voyages landed in New England ports. Over 40,000 kidnapped Africans were trafficked into slavery in the Americas during these voyages, including at least 5,000 into New England. Thousands of kidnapped Africans (nearly 15% of all those trafficked) died during the Middle Passage, the harrowing journey from Africa to the Americas.

Northern colonies founded on the ideals of equality and freedom used slavery to finance their growing economies. Shipbuilding, manufacturing, insurance, banking, and commerce in the North relied heavily on the enslavement and exploitation of Black people.

White new Englanders exploited slavery in their personal lives as well. By 1730, nearly half of all New York City residents personally enslaved Black people - a higher percentage than any colonial city except Charleston, South Carolina. By 1754, enslaved people made up 10% of the population in Boston; and by the start of the Revolutionary War, one in four households in Connecticut enslaved at least one black person.

FINANCE TEAM NEWS

TREASURER'S UPDATE THROUGH MARCH 15, 2023 Dollars Supporting Mission & Ministry

On March 11th members of our congregation met for four hours to envision our core mission and ministry for the coming years. Outcome was to create a financial plan, renovate our building that houses our mission and ministry, and reach out into the community. Specifics are yet to come, but here are some notes on <u>what we have been doing so far this year</u>:

- Our long-anticipated chancel suite has been delivered and will be dedicated in our worship space the next few weeks. Rev. Erich Thompson, Sacred Space, has been paid in full from special gifts provided by nine families in 2021-2022. There is a pledge outstanding for the delivery costs. Two blown glass pieces by our local Hot Shop Valpo will be created for the font and pulpit once the chancel suite is in place, to assess lighting and scale, through two gifts promised and additional designated gifts invited.
- Giving for the operating budget through pledges, general gifts, and per capita contributions totals \$177,522 to date. In addition, there were designated gifts beyond the budget totaling \$18,130 that include \$6,716 for mission, \$1,500 for our preschool, \$500 for guest musicians, and \$475 in memorial gifts. \$770 was given to our capital fund. We received the promised Center for Congregations grant for \$13,263 to help fund our congregational visioning process.
- In addition to dispersing the funds contributed for the chancel suite, our church sent out \$12,221 for missions, and our resale shop distributed an additional \$8,050 in other mission dollars.
- Our budgeted operating expenses paid through March 15 including payroll totaled \$110,389. So far this year we paid out \$51,053 in designated funds on hand (some from late December giving).

<u>What does this mean?</u> Several delivered their year's pledge in January, so operating income is a little ahead if giving were linear. But our giving patterns have changed. Some use weekly envelopes, some give monthly, some quarterly, some give online, some give from savings like tax-favored Qualified Charitable Distributions from IRAs, some give as they receive extra income, like legacy gifts for operations. We have faithful, generous donors. Of our 285 or so members, 93 pledged, and another 10 or so families give regularly as though they had pledged. So creative thinking this year will be led by our stewardship, planned giving and campaign teams for financial planning for the long-term.

Why is additional giving for mission and ministry important? Day-to-day our current needs are funded.

- But we all should be aware that our total investments of \$237,969 include \$125,029 in designated/ temporarily restricted funds leaving \$112,940 in reserve operating funds in addition to the \$70,618 currently in our checking account.
- The rule-of-thumb for churches is to hold 4-6 months in reserve to continue worship, staffing and ministry if there is some crisis or unexpected expenses, and it's not difficult to imagine that is possible. Four months would be \$136,000; six months would be \$204,000.

<u>Our capital fund</u> has \$66,697 that includes a grant from the Smock Foundation for \$25,000 and matching funds of \$30,000 which are restricted by the grant for ADA compliance improvements for the elderly and those with mobility challenges. There is also a restricted gift of \$10,200 to repair and maintain the pavilion.

- That leaves \$1,497 unrestricted in our capital fund, and as we learned last winter, one HVAC replacement unit runs more than \$17,000 including inspections and installation.
- So our reserves are thin, both for operating expenses and for capital improvements. We have no debt, and our B&G team is providing nearly daily maintenance and repairs. Our people, our programs, our building continue to support ministry in our community for today.

What we <u>do</u>, <u>our actions</u> are inspired by our faith, by <u>our commitment</u> to live the Gospel in this place and strengthen our congregation for Christ's church of tomorrow. Be involved and stay engaged as we take stock and seek what we can do as a more vibrant congregation, transformed by God's love.
