Rev. Kimber-lee D. Adams was duly elected by vote of the congregation to the post of Pastor/ Head of Staff at First Presbyterian Church – Valparaiso on Sunday, July 28, 2019.

This new chapter in the life of our church begins on September 16, 2019, Pastor Kimber-lee's starting date with FPCV.

WHY THIS DATE? Pastor Adams was not able to give notice of her resignation to her current congregation until after her appointment was confirmed at our Congregation Meeting on Sunday, July 28th.

Just as we would want, proper notice within the Presbyterian Church USA by departing pastors is customarily four (4) weeks. Pastor Adams advised her current congregation on Monday, July 29th.

When her time with her current church is completed, Pastor Adams needs two weeks to finalize her move to Valparaiso which will include preparing her household to be moved via truck to a new residence in the Valparaiso area where house-hunting is currently fully underway. Once the new residence is selected, there is the actual move itself and time to get as settled as one can in a short period of time. All going well, she will be ready to assume her new role on September 16th.

The Adams family is extremely thankful for the wonderful reception they have received by our congregation and this community and they are truly looking forward to being part of our church family.

SESSION SYNOPSIS OF AUGUST 12, 2019

"Happy New Year!" That is how Elder Rhonda Coffin opened her devotions, reminding everyone that it is the season of new beginnings: a new school year has launched; our church family soon embarks on a new journey with Pastor Kimber-lee Adams leading our congregation; and the 2020 Stewardship Campaign will be kicking off soon in which we are seeking "20/20 Vision" for our future. Rhonda challenged Elders to discern *God's Vision* for their teams moving forward as budgets are planned for 2020.

Despite all the new beginnings, there is also some sadness in that it was also an ending: the final meeting with our own Pastor Nancy Becker as Moderator. She took the opportunity to thank the Session, affirming what a privilege, a joy, and an honor it has been for her to "lead the leaders" of your congregation. Elders likewise thanked Pastor Nancy for her willingness to again serve as our Moderator this past year. Her leadership has helped keep the climate positive and moving forward through the challenging time without a pastor, and she received many thanks and applause.

Two important meetings have been called for the Congregation. The first will be a CALLED MEETING OF THE CONGREGATION ON SEPTEMBER 29, 2019, (following the 9:00 a.m. service) so the Congregational Nominating Committee can present its slate of officers (elders and deacons) to be voted upon. The second is the ANNUAL MEETING OF THE CONGREGATION ON JANUARY 26, 2020 (again following the 9:00 a.m. service). This is the meeting during which the 2019 Annual Report is approved; the 2020 Operating Budget is received; officers for the Corporation are presented; Terms of Call are approved; and Members-at-Large are elected to the Congregational Nominating Committee. Virtually any other matter may also be brought up at this Annual Meeting!

There was quite a lot of additional business conducted by your Elders:

- CELEBRATION SUNDAY HAS BEEN MOVED TO OCTOBER 20, 2019, since our new pastor will be coming onboard in mid-September. This will be a one-worship service at 10:00 a.m. followed by a congregational luncheon.
- Beginning September 1, 2019, the TRADITIONAL WORSHIP SERVICE will begin at 9:00 A.M. and the CONTEMPORARY SERVICE will begin at 11:00 A.M.
- CHRISTMAS EVE SERVICES on December 24, 2019, will be held at 4:00 p.m. and 7:00 p.m.
- The Indiana Dunes Great Banquet Community presented an expanded request to use the church facility to accommodate overnight guests during their upcoming fall weekends. After considerable discussion, Elders voted to give provisional approval pending satisfactory answers to a number of concerns. It was agreed that if these concerns are resolved, having the teams and guests in our church would provide a tremendous opportunity for ministry and outreach.
- ➢ In honor of the 77th year of the Presbyterian Resale Shop's presence in Valparaiso, Session approved a request for a member to borrow several items from the church to decorate one of the Shop's display windows throughout the month of October. Be sure to check out both the Shop and the windows which the members work really hard on!
- The Presbytery Review of Session Minutes and the Register was completed on June 29, 2019, found to be in order, and approved by Session.

Finally, a Welcome Plan for Pastor Kim is in the works. Look for more information and opportunities to continue to extend hospitality and greetings to the Adams family as they too experience new beginnings: new schools for Emma and Andrew; a new home; a new church family; and all new experiences in and around the Valparaiso community. The warmth, friendliness, kindness, and generosity of this congregation is well-known; let us continue this trend as we welcome this wonderful family!

GUATEMALA MISSION TRIP NEWS



On September 21 through September 28, 2019, six of us from First Presbyterian Church will join four others to travel to Oasis, San Lucas, Guatemala. The purpose of our mission trip is to care for the caregivers. We will meet and nurture the "Tias" (or Housemothers) who administer to and pour love onto the very young and traumatized victims of abuse. These Tias work ten days on, four days off, and some take a bus for seven hours one way to come work at Oasis. Often, they spend more time with the girls at Oasis than with their own families. They do this because they believe they are called by our Lord to do as he taught - to love one another as He loves us. We will share God's love with these ladies and remind them how incredibly treasured they are.

We appreciate the love and support that our church has given to us. We are leading a Bible study with the Tias every day in the morning. The afternoons are times for us to share God's love through relaxing arts and crafts, snacks and sharing stories.


We are asking you to be part of this mission trip by providing prayers as we work as a team preparing and while we are in Guatemala.
