2 Corinthians 9:6-8 – The point is this: the one who sows sparingly will also reap sparingly, and the one who sows bountifully will also reap bountifully. Each of you must give as you have made up your mind, not reluctantly or under compulsion, for God loves a cheerful giver. And God is able to provide you with every blessing in abundance, <u>so that</u> by always having enough of everything, you may share abundantly in every good work.

So that. These two little words, so inconsequential, yet so full. So that. They remind me of a mathematics equation, like 2 + 2 = 4. This and this means that. This side of the equation gives you that side of the equation.

It reminds me of the kinds of things we say to children: eat your peas and vegetables, so that you can grow up to be strong. Do your homework, so that you will get an A / ace the test / not make your teacher mad! We even know these to be true as adults: drive responsibly so that you will not get a ticket / cause an accident / keep your insurance rates down. Just listing these reminds me that there are many, many consequences to the actions we choose to make every day.

The apostle Paul likes 'so that.' A lot. And so that reminds us that, if we choose to follow Jesus, if we claim he is our Savior, if we want to be his disciple, our lives are lived so that.... In other words, once we jump on Jesus' train, life is lived differently.

Life is lived differently, not for ourselves but for others. God provides, <u>so that</u> we can share God's provision with those who have needs. God gives, <u>so that</u> we can give. God loves us, <u>so that</u> we can love others. God shows us mercy, <u>so that</u> we can give mercy. We are conduits, through which others can see and experience God, <u>so that</u> they too can choose to trust their lives to the Lord.

Fall is harvest time, and our church has just finished its stewardship drive, as we seek to build our 2018 church budget. But stewardship is more than just the monies promised. Our lives are to be lived as good stewards of ALL that God blesses each of us with. What we are given, in time, skills, joys, even sorrows, are also things we are stewards of, and can be shared/used/learned from for others in God's kingdom.

May we all live into this harvest season, then, literally harvesting in our choices and actions what God has so richly blessed us each with, finding ways to share it with others, <u>so that</u> the Kingdom of God flourishes, even here and now.

Session Synopsis of September 18, 2017

Two very positive reports were received this month. First, the Finance Team announced that the required Annual Audit has been completed by our own Ralph Pollaro, who stated that the 2016 financial statements of the First Presbyterian Church were found to be in order with no modifications needing to be made! This is due in part to the excellent work being done by our Treasurer Ruth Dickey and Business Manager Beverlee Frazee, so be sure to thank them the next time you see them. In addition, your Clerk attended Presbytery's Annual Review of Session Minutes and Registers on August 28, and all books were found to be in order with *no exceptions*. It looks like we are set for another year!

You are probably already aware that two familiar faces have taken on new roles at FPC. Rhonda Clark has been hired to direct both the Adult Choir and the Tone Chimes, and Ken Crews is returning to us as an "official" Student Pastor (now that he has most of his seminary coursework completed). Ken will also be spending some of his time at Portage Presbyterian Church, as we walk alongside them in ministry. We are certainly thrilled that both are serving God among us!

Session also participated in an extended conversation concerning an excerpt from *Canoeing the Mountains*, a book by Tod Bolsinger. Pastor Mark shared some statistics about church in the 21st century. It is clear that the church is nearing an end to the era of privilege it has enjoyed for over 1,700 years. Churches nationwide (and worldwide) are experiencing declining membership and are having to work harder and harder to maintain levels of attendance, participation, and giving. You may realize that the same is true at FPC! The discussion helped Elders understand that we probably don't need to be trying harder to do what has been done in the past (which isn't really working); rather we need to redefine what the Sabbath IS for our church and be willing to try new things and do things in different ways. A perfect example is what we are doing with our Kids of the Kingdom program. Sunday school at 10:00 a.m. wasn't working well for many, so our Christian Education team is experimenting with a new format and approach during both worship services. They will evaluate effectiveness and progress in another month or so, and if changes still need to be made, we hope to be flexible enough to adapt! In fact, it is that Adaptive Leadership that is needed as we move ahead, searching for ways we can reach and connect with those who want to be connected. We will try to LISTEN and let people KNOW WE CARE in order to create an authentic sense of community. Part of that Adaptive Leadership is to critically examine some of the things we have been doing in the past (programs and activities), and if they aren't working, we are going to have to let them go away! What we may need to do is figure out how to "put the FUN back in DYSFUNC-TION!" If you have any suggestions or ideas, be sure to let your Session members know!

Endowment Committee News

A Useful Tax Saving Strategy for Charitable Giving (For those 70 ½ and older)

There is a story written by Loren Eiseley's, The Star Thrower. In it, a wise old man finds a young man throwing beached starfish into the ocean. The old man tells the young man that he can't make a difference throwing back one starfish at a time when there are so many washed up on shore.

At this, the young man bent down, picked up yet another starfish, and threw it into the ocean. As it met the water, he said, "It made a difference for that one."

What does Giving mean to you? There are several strategies that we are allowed to use and thereby make a more impactful gift. The Endowment Committee encourages individuals planning year-end gifts to the church to consider taking advantage of the following tax saving strategy.

Fund Gifts with IRA Required Minimum Distributions (RMD)

Beginning at age 70 ¹/₂, you are required to take a specified amount (your RMD) out of your IRA each year. You must now pay the taxes you avoided when you put the money in the IRA, unless you take advantage of the IRA Charitable Rollover provision.

By directing the yearly mandatory withdrawal (RMD) from your IRA be made directly to an IRS approved charity, you do not pay income tax on this money. You do not have to direct 100% of your RMD to the charity but, again, only the donated portion would be subject to the tax benefit.

This strategy is a good fit with the current tax climate. In addition, you also have a better chance of:

- 1. Lowering the portion of your Social Security income subject to taxation,
- 2. Keeping Medicare premiums low,
- 3. Keeping taxable income low if you take the standard deduction, and/or
- 4. Reducing your vulnerability to the IRS Pease Limitation on itemized deductions.

One caveat: For each donation, you'll have IRA withdrawal paperwork to complete. In light of these paperwork requirements, consider restricting this strategy for your larger contributions.

Think of this strategy as reducing income subject to taxation (and thus taxes) without having to worry about whether you are eligible for full use of itemized deductions. And, by all means, do consult your accountant or financial advisor if you need further guidance regarding the use of IRA distributions to complete charitable gifts.

"Thank You" and An Update from Geneva Center

The Board of Directors and the staff of Geneva Center send a big THANK YOU to the congregation of First Presbyterian Valparaiso for the \$842 gift that came from your July <u>Second Mile Offering</u>.

The property and buildings of Geneva Center are still owned by the Presbytery of Wabash Valley and the board of directors of Geneva Center, Inc. (a separate non-profit entity that is responsible for the operations) is committed to operating in concert with the historical mission of Geneva Center.

The board of GCI and the staff are working hard to get the <u>revenue from operations</u> to a level that can support GCI's <u>operational expenses</u> year over year. Reaching this level of revenue will then allow the donations and financial support from individuals and churches to be used for the <u>capital expenditures</u> that have and will arise in properly caring for and maintaining the 235-acre property and all of its facilities. Repairs, replacements, maintenance and upgrades take funds and thus Geneva Center will always need funding beyond what revenues from operations can provide.

The first nine months of 2017 were good financially for Geneva Center.

- <u>Revenues from operations</u> including Summer Camp with 275 campers have been about 30% higher than for the same period in 2016.
- Expenses have been virtually equal to last year
- Donations & Gifts through 9.30.17 of over \$63,000 have been very important to Geneva Ctr.
- There is a \$25,000 challenge matching grant received in late March from a couple who wish to remain anonymous that has only had \$8,500 of eligible donations received thus far. If we can match the remaining \$16,500 before year's end with individual gifts and support from churches, Geneva Center could receive the full \$25,000 match. [FPCV's gift will be matched.]
- Future bookings (groups committed for the remainder of 2017) are decent and slightly above last year, although there are plenty of available dates in October, November, December, January & February that staff is working hard to fill. These months with weak revenues really hurt the cash flow. Being recognized as a *year-round retreat center* is taking a lot of communication and promotional effort, which is on-going.

The GCI Board has embarked on a longer range <u>strategic planning process</u> now that it is closer to securing the future of Geneva Center. The progress has been real and the commitment to preserving and continuing the legacy of Geneva Center, its impact on the lives of people who attend events there, remains strong. *Thank You* First Presbyterian - Valparaiso for your continued support.


