

Session Synopsis of August 16, 2023

Following an opening prayer, welcome issued to visitors, and approval of the agenda, Elders spend time monthly studying some aspect of our faith. This year, emphasis has been on the Book of Confessions. Currently Elders are reading the *Scots Confession* which was ratified in 1560. Discussion included the problematic language from that time period as well as the judgmental attitudes toward the "Romanists" (Catholics). It was reflective of the times and as much a political document as a religious one, but it was noted that it helps us understand not only our own history but also how those earlier views shaped who we are as a Church today (thankfully, "Reformed and always Reforming according to the Word of God").

With the success of the Sharing Table Project, Elders now have the enjoyable task of determining and prioritizing how that money should be spent. As you may recall, there were five priorities which were identified to provide the foundation for our best possible future. Those five areas were (1) Care for Our Facilities; (2) Outreach and Communication; (3) Funding the Mission Plan; (4) Grow Community Partnerships; and (5) Grow Faith Formation/Learning Programs. In the next several months, Elders will be asking their teams to prioritize their own "wish lists" for the disbursement of the funds that are even now beginning to come in. Preliminary requests will be shared at the December 6 Session meeting, and we would also like to encourage members of the congregation to contribute thoughts and ideas as to how these funds should be distributed. Please contact an Elder and attend a team meeting to share *your* priorities with your leaders!

In addition, the following motions were approved:

- Membership Team has called a Session Meeting for Sunday, September 17, for the purpose of meeting with and welcoming the New Members Class.
- **Building & Grounds** approved two motions regarding Scouts
 - 1) To allow Cub Scout Pack 902 (Cooks Corners) to have their pack meeting at the Pavilion on August 22 from 6:00-8:00 with no fees to be charged.
 - 2) To allow Dunes Moraine BSA Adult Leader Training with appropriate fees to be charged to cover custodial fees under the condition that a date can be found.
 - 3) Session approved recommending that B & G create a subcommittee to include members from B & G as well as additional church members to look into alternative solutions for dealing with imminent energy needs.
- Faith Formation amended a June motion to hold the concert by Danen Kane on October 21, 2023, in the Sanctuary with proceeds designated for the Caring Place.
- Reports were received from the following:
 - 1) Congregational Nominating Committee ~ The slate of officers is nearly complete!
 - 2) Administrative Commission ~ Moderator Bruce Roth again updated Session on the progress being made concerning the Presbyterian Church Resale Shop.
 - 3) Faith Formation ("FF")
 - A) Reminder was given that photographing and/or publishing of children's pictures are *not* permitted without written consent of the parent/guardian; this includes photos taken during any church activity by anyone (including grandparents!)
 - B) FF and Membership Teams are excited to begin implementing a new *Connections Desk* beginning September 10 to be located in the narthex to welcome visitors to our facility.
 - 4) **Stewardship** ~ Fall timeline is moving according to plan.

5) Finance

- A) Giving is slightly ahead of the budgeted plan and expenses are slightly below the budgeted plan, so finances appear to be in good shape.
- B) Auditors will meet with Finance the week of September 17 for a consultation and financial review.
- C) Sharing Table funds are coming in already and are being invested to earn about 5% interest while awaiting disbursement.

6) **Personnel**

- A) The exit interview was conducted with Associate Pastor Ken Crews.
- B) We will probably employ one of our part-time custodians to also work part time at the Presbyterian Church Resale Shop beginning in October.
- Other reports were received from Pastor Kim, Pastor Ken, iEngage, Membership Clerk, and the Clerk of Session.
- And as always, Joys and Concerns were shared:
 - Prayers of healing for Pastor Nancy who is recuperating following knee replacement as well as prayers for husband Mike as he is her primary caregiver.
 - Prayers for Pastor Kim's family as husband Jason's uncle has passed.
 - Prayers for Pastor Ken and his family as they transition to a new church family and joy for his ministry among our community over the last several years.
 - Prayers of praise and excitement at the Presbyterian Church Resale Shop with all that is happening for good, especially the new cash register/computer that will enable the shop to receive credit and debit cards.


While the faith journey is indeed a personal one, it is not meant to be traveled alone!

STEWARDSHIP TEAM NEWS



Stewardship is working closely with the Finance Team to share a reliable 2024 budget goal supporting God's Bountiful Table for the church's Ministry Vision. This goal differs from the Sharing Table Project presented during previous months which focuses primarily on facilities upgrades, communication improvements, broadening missions, growing Faith Formation and the growth and development of community partnerships.

God's Bountiful Table concentrates on the 2024 church budget needs and is similar to how you might plan for your own family's budget. First Presbyterian Church's budget goal for 2024 is between \$550,000 and \$650,000 which includes Staff, Worship and Music, Congregational Life, Missions, Faith Formation, and Maintenance and Repairs as well as our relationships with our FPC Resale Shop and our on-site Preschool (PWNS) both of which are self-supported.

Between August 20 and October 22, the Stewardship Team will present personal testimonies, pledging information and suggestions we hope will be helpful as you prayerfully consider a pledging decision that will be a blessing in your lives.

Mid-September you will receive your pledge card, an invitation to God's Bountiful Table celebration meal and a response card to indicate your attendance which can either be mailed or called in to the church office. There will also be posters displayed in the Narthex during September and October to donate a pie or cupcakes for the meal. If you would like to be a table host during the meal, you may also volunteer.

The culmination of this time of prayerful consideration will be Sunday, October 22, 2023. We are asking that you present your completed pledge card at the communion table during the service that Sunday and then join your church family at God's Bountiful Table in Fellowship Hall immediately following the service.

We look forward to your support and sharing God's Bountiful Table on October 22, 2023.

A STEWARDSHIP LOVE STORY

In Matthew ~ Chapter 22, The Pharisees were questioning Jesus when they asked him "Which is the most important commandment in the law of Moses?" Jesus replied, "You must love the Lord your God with all your heart, all your soul, and all your mind. This is the first and greatest commandment. A second is equally important. Love your neighbors as yourself. The entire law ... is based on these two commandments."

When Kim & I first came to First Presbyterian Church, 46 years ago, everyone welcomed us with opened arms and warm hearts.

We quickly learned that this Congregation lives the kind of Love that Jesus spoke of every day of the year.

There are thousands of love stories that occurred within these walls. And all of these stories demonstrate a basic trust in the Holy Spirit and a belief in the teachings of our Lord Jesus Christ.

Our three children were Baptized here. All of our kids received their "Soft & Warm" baby quilts, handmade by the ladies of this Church. And, I might add, they still have all three quilts forty some years later.

They attended Sunday school, vacation bible school, Presbys, traveled on various mission trips, attended Confirmation classes and presented their "Statements of Faith" to Session.

Our oldest daughter was married here. Two of our grandchildren were baptized here; and as an Elder, I fought to hold back tears when I asked you, the Congregation, if you would: Nurture them, Love them, and Guide them to be Faithful Disciples of Christ.

Our son-in-law struggled through three brain surgeries and you not only prayed for him but actually helped with his recovery.

I don't ever remember calling to ask for help; however, someone did put out the call when we needed to get our daughter our 1-year-old grandson and his dad to our house for his recovery. So on a sunny, Saturday, morning about 35 Presbyterians armed with trucks, trailers and empty boxes showed up at their apartment where they packed up, loaded, moved and unpacked this entire little family in about two hours!! That has to be one of the quickest home moves on record.

Of course the bigger Blessing is that our son-in-law fully recovered and is doing well.

During all of these years Kim & I have volunteered to work on almost every committee there is here at First Presbyterian.

More recently Kim has been struggling with multiple health issues and without any hesitation many of you have come forward to support and help us with meals, transportation, running errands and loving friendship.

Have you ever seen a Redwood Sequoia? It is the world's largest tree by volume. They can grow nearly 300 feet tall and 26 feet in diameter. Because the Sequoia is so tall it needs to have a strong foundation to keep it upright.

Amazingly; 95% of the Sequoia's roots are within the top three feet of the soils surface. However; the roots of these trees intertwine with those of other Sequoia trees around it, creating one huge root system underground.

Above ground we see these huge trees standing alone – yet underneath they all rely on each other for that critical Support. These intertwined roots enable the trees to share their strength with each other, to combat storms and bring in needed resources for their growth and health."

We all need to remember that we, in unity, are each other's Support. We are members of the Body of Christ. We all have been blessed with different gifts and abilities and as members of the Body, we must remember that we are not individuals alone.

None of us is any more important than another. We are a family in Christ and we will always be among brothers and sisters in faith.

We are all here to work together, roots intertwined like the giant sequoias, to survive, to thrive, to do and be what God has called us together to do.

In 2nd Timothy, Chapter 1, Paul the Apostle reminds us that God does not want Us to be shy with the Lord's gifts; God wants us to be Bold, Loving and Wise.

It is because of the Blessings Kim & I have received and because of the Love and Friendship that all of you have shown our Family that we will FOREVER work to support First Presbyterian Church and this Congregation.

Paul the Apostle mentions in 1 Corinthians, Ch. 12, that there are different kinds of gifts but the same Spirit, and different kinds of service but the same Lord.

Kim & I pray that you too will support First Presbyterian Church and that you realize that no matter how large or small that support may be we simply need to trust in the Lord and allow the Holy Spirit to guide our decisions.

And please know that you are truly Loved here at First Presbyterian Church.

Thank you Church Family.


THE CONNECTION DESK – WHAT IS IT?

OPPORTUNITY

Informed Giving... If You are 70 1/2 or Older and Have an IRA

Since they doubled the standard deduction, ninety percent of us can no longer take a tax deduction for money we give to the church. However, we can eliminate the taxes due on any money we take from an IRA... IF the money is sent directly from our account to the church.

At age 70 ½, we may begin to voluntarily take money from an IRA.

Those of us, 73 or older, <u>must</u> take a specified amount, our Required Minimum Distribution (RMD), from our IRA each year. Any time we take money out of an IRA, we must pay the taxes we avoided when we put the money in.

Here is an example:

- Assume Mary's RMD requires her to take \$3000 out of her IRA this year. She also wants to give \$3000 to the church for The Sharing Table.
- Option 1: She can have this money sent to herself. It is considered income, and she would pay \$720 more income tax (if she is in the 24% tax bracket). \$3000- (\$720 taxes) = \$2280.
- She has only \$2280 to give to the church because she will owe \$720 at tax time.
- Option 2: She can request her RMD money be sent <u>directly</u> to First Presbyterian Church Valparaiso, and she <u>would pay no taxes on this money</u>. \$3000-\$0 = \$3000 will be transferred in her name to the church!
- The government takes \$0 in taxes!
- {If she wants to donate only \$2000 directly to the church, she can have the remaining \$1000 (only \$720 after taxes) sent to herself.}
- > Donations from your IRA (required or voluntary) transferred directly to the church are called:

Qualified Charitable Deductions (QCD'S)

- So, if Mary has the check sent to her, she only has \$2280 to give to the church after paying the taxes.
- By having the money sent directly to the church (via a QCD), Mary can donate the full \$3000!
- All it takes is a phone call to the custodian of your IRA (or your accountant/financial advisor). They can help you set up the process (paperwork) and timing for sending out your QCD checks this year. To avoid the steep penalty for forgetting to take your RMD, it might be wise to consider this option soon for this year.
