REMINDER.

IMPORTANT INFORMATION FOR ANYONE WHO CAN CHECK ALL THE BOXES
I am 72 or older.
I have an IRA.
I donate money to the church.
Rather than itemizing deductions on our tax return, most of us now take the <u>standard deduction</u> : for 2022 it is \$14,700 (single and over 65) or \$28,700 (married and over 65). Thus we no longer get a tax deduction for money we give to qualified charities. However, if you checked the three boxes above, you still can donate money and lower your taxes . Here is why and how:
Beginning at age 72, you must take a specified amount, your Required Minimum Distribution (RMD), out of your IRA each year. You must now start paying the taxes you avoided when you put the money in the IRA.
Assume Mary is required to take \$3000 out of her IRA this year. She also wants to give \$3000 to the church.
 She can have this money sent to herself. It is considered income, and she would pay \$720 more in taxes (if she is in the 24% tax bracket). \$3000-\$720 (to taxes) = \$2280 left for charities
2. She can request this money be sent <u>directly</u> to First Presbyterian Church Valparaiso and she would pay no taxes on this money. \$3000-\$0= the full \$3000 goes to the church.
3. Yes, if she wanted to donate only \$2000, she could have the remaining \$1000 (\$720 after taxes) sent to her.
4. Also, she can request the money be distributed among two or more charities.
These donations are called Qualified Charitable Deductions (QCD's).
All it takes is a phone call to the custodian of your IRA (or your accountant/financial advisor). They can help you set up the process and timing for sending out your QCD checks this year. This needs to be done now to ensure it is completed by December 31.


OPPORTUNITY – LITURGIST MINISTRY

MATTHEW 25 NEWS



SACRED GROUND is a dialogue series around race designed for these times. It is an attempt to be responsive to the profound challenges that currently exist in our society. It is focused on the conflicts and questions that swirl around issues of race and racism, as well as the difficult but respectful and transformative dialogue we need to have with each other about them. It invites participants to walk back through history in order to peel away the layers that brought

us to today, and to do so in a personal way, reflecting on family histories and stories, as well as important narratives that shape the collective American story.

- It is built around **powerful documentary films and readings**, which we are pleased to bring you and which will serve as the jumping-off point for dialogue.
- ➤ Participants commit to assigned films and readings, which will seem manageable to some and perhaps a lot to others. There is a maximum of 90 minutes of film/video to watch per session, and an average of 35 pages to read.
- The series brings participants' attention to various key chapters in U.S. history of race and racism, as well some of the latest thinking by scholars and practitioners of racial healing, racial equity, and whiteness.
- ➤ It focuses on Indigenous, Black, Latino, and Asian American histories as they intersect with European American histories.
- > It emphasizes personal story-sharing and deepening relationships.
- ➤ It invites exploration of how people of color have been harmed by racism, and how white people have been hurt in other ways, creating a shared if deeply unequal brokenness that **compels us to overcome these legacies in deliberate partnership**. This work can take various shapes.
- It strongly encourages people to constitute dialogue groups with socioeconomic and political diversity, which may involve partnering with another congregation (Episcopal or other).
- ➤ It puts attention on issues related to race, while also examining how those issues intersect with family history, class status, regional identity (regional cultures, urban/rural divides, coasts versus heartland), and political identity (red states/blue states, Trump-related divides).
- ➤ This series, framed as a spiritual journey, is grounded in the Christian faith in the example of Jesus Christ and the power of scripture, prayer, God's grace, and the Holy Spirit—to help us step closer to the dream of beloved community.

The Indiana Kentucky Synod of the ELCA, in partnership with Christ Lutheran Church, invites you to join in this discussion circle beginning January 18, 2023 and meeting every other Wednesday for 11 sessions, each 90 minutes, from 6:00-7:30 pm CST/7:00-8:30 pm EST. During Lent, a session for clergy and church staff committed to worship on Wednesday evenings during Lent will be offered on the following Thursday at 11:00 am CST/ noon. We will meet via Zoom. Registration will open November 1, 2022 and close December 19, 2022, or when 80 participants have registered.

MATTHEW 25 REFLECTION



"Matthew 25 Reflection" presents information chosen by our Matthew 25 Team to inform and inspire our church family to actively engage in activities and with initiatives that reduce poverty and racism in our local communities and beyond.

WE MUST TALK ABOUT RACE TO FIX ECONOMIC INEQUALITY

(Abridged comments from video produced by Demos.org)

The disparity between the rich and the poor in our nation is greater than it has ever been. In 2021, 10% of the people in the U.S. owned 70% of the wealth; the bottom 50% owned 2%.

Some people say talking about race will divide us, but we are already divided.

We are divided because there is constant, intentional "race talk" in our political society. Politicians have learned they can use race to win votes. They don't talk about race expressly, but they use "dog whistles." The definition of Dog Whistle Politics: When politicians use coded language they defend as benign but is intended to provoke strong emotional responses in their target audiences. Think about terms like "illegal aliens," "entitlements," "freeloaders, "inner city crime," "drug testing for welfare recipients." What color faces do you associate with those terms?

Think about terms like "the Silent Majority," "the Heartland," "Real Americans," "hard working taxpayers," "law and order," What color faces do you associate with those terms?

Racism has had and continues to have a substantial influence on election results.

They foster deep-seated fears and biases that lead us to fight against each other, distrust each other, and to resent and distrust ineffective government. As the government is frozen in a stalemate, we turn control over to the very rich who thrive in the status quo and do not want change. As a result, they maintain policies that have created them massive wealth inequality...all sold to the American public through a narrative of racial resentment.

The changes we need for the good of all: improving the environment, assuring the future of Social Security, reigning in Wall Street, reducing the wealth gap, stand at a political stalemate as corporations and the wealthy thrive and the wealth gap widens.

Racism is a belief in a hierarchy of human value that some people are just worth more than others. That doesn't just affect the people who are seen as worthless because **all our fates are linked together**. Only as the power of racism is acknowledged and redirected can "change for the good of the vast majority be accomplished and economic inequality be reduced.

PRAYER: Heavenly Father, help us to realize that the fates of all fellow Americans are linked together. Help us to realize that Systemic Racism and Economic Inequality are corrosive and destructive problems that must be addressed and corrected. Direct us in our efforts to do a better job of confronting these issues in our nation, our community, and ourselves. Amen.

STEWARDSHIP AND FINANCE NEWS

'TIS THE SEASON FOR GIVING, AND FOR THANKSGIVING!

Conversations about First Presbyterian Church – Valpo being a "vibrant congregation" began in March 2020 when we all thought that COVID would be a short blip in the life of our congregation. We were chosen and funded as one of three churches from our Presbytery along with others from our Synod to engage in congregational coaching toward <u>living with a theology of abundance</u> and <u>envisioning opportunities for new ministry</u>. Instead of in-person conversations and retreats as expected, we met for 18 months via Zoom. For our congregation, that worked!

Have we envisioned and enriched opportunities for ministry, new and old? Yes!

- Each week we catch glimpses of our vitality, in our worship with music, arts, the Word Proclaimed, and our sending out live our mission of serving Christ by serving others through ministry teams and personal efforts.
- We have a lively PrayGround where children gather with us during worship with things to keep their hands busy while we know they are immersed in listening and get coached during the Children's Moment about the key message of the day.
- We reinvigorated our Presbys group of young people, we welcomed multiple new members introduced through our "Presbyterian 101" classes, our preschool is back up and running with energetic new teachers, and our 80-year-old resale shop continues to serve our community in greater numbers than ever.
- ➤ We thrive with the creative preaching, teaching and visioning of our dynamic pastor and have just initiated a call for an associate pastor, another dynamic preacher and teacher we know and love!
- And this is not by any means a complete list of ministries either initiated or enriched by new visions. So much for which to be thankful!

As for living with <u>a theology of abundance</u>? Yes!

- As of November 22nd, we are on-track to exceed our estimated giving that supports our 2022 Budget. With five weeks to go in 2022, we have received \$448,920 in total income. 25 pledges are paid in full and some continue above and beyond with their giving; 52 more are mostly or partially fulfilled and we anticipate regular trends of giving continuing through December.
- Our people provided special gifts through offerings for 2nd Mile ministries, Faith Formation programs, worship and music needs, Bikes for Kids, supplies for Indiana Burn Camp for children, Presbyterian Worship & Music Conference, chancel furnishings, Angel Tree and Hilltop Pantry Christmas gifts, and so many other giving opportunities. That total includes \$70,346 given for capital investments and the chancel furnishings.
- ➤ Our pledged giving for 2023 is ahead of where we were at this time for 2022. It remains to be seen whether we will have a balanced budget, but to date we have 82 responses pledging or continuing giving totaling \$420,032 for the operating fund. Stewardship responses continue to trickle in and pledges or assurances are welcome and never too late.

We already held our Celebration Sunday in October to recognize and say thank you for the generosity expressed by so many of you to fund our mission and ministries in 2023. Thank you for the giving that sustains us week by week in amounts large and small, as each of us is able, but together for our shared work of Christ the King and his Kin-dom!
