SESSION SYNOPSIS OF APRIL 27, 2022

Your Clerk of Session is indeed very glad to be back from Florida (despite the usual unpredictable spring weather!), but before sharing details of the April meeting, I want to give a huge shout out and thank you to Jim Hubbard for doing such an excellent job of filling in during my absence. He definitely understands the importance of communication and did a fantastic job of keeping you all informed about Session's activities. Thanks, Jim!

The April meeting was long but with much good conversation and many positive decisions made by the nine elders present. **Elder Training** began with a discussion of the article *Highlighting the Verbs*. Conversation centered on the verbs in the first question each was asked during ordination: "Do you *trust*, *acknowledge*, and *believe* in Jesus Christ?" Elders shared how concentrating on the verbs changed their perspectives and helped them remember that Jesus *IS* Lord of all and head of the church. Keeping that in mind when making decisions makes it easier to take the right action and not dwell on the "why's." Other important verbs are *serve*, *respond*, *love*, *receive*, *act*.

HOLY LIVING ~ TEAM OF THE MONTH ~ BUILDING & GROUNDS (Marc Buehler, Vic Klancer)

(Each month one of the Ministry Teams takes responsibility for describing their work and responsibilities, are prayed for by the other teams and report how that felt, what they learned being in prayer for the wider community, and give reflections on worship)

- Marc and Vic shared that being prayed for brought a sense of relief and gratitude, often resulting in many prayers being returned. They were thankful but also felt the need to keep priorities in perspective, as there are so many things to pray for.
- ➤ Praying for the community challenged them to carry our Christian message out into that community which is hard but then sometimes offers the opportunity to share faith stories with others who might not hear them otherwise (this also allows others to open up to us).
- Easter services were fantastic, 'Humor Sunday' was a new concept, and recent liturgist Johnny Lawson (March 27) was so inspiring, impressive and sincere: the Holy Spirit is working in us and in our church!

REGULAR BUSINESS

- Accepted were the reports submitted by Ministry Teams and Staff, and <u>approved</u> were Minutes of past meetings, including an <u>email motion</u> to support a pop-up mission to collect items for **Hoosier Burn Camp** to help them with their summer camp needs.
- ➤ <u>Continued</u> the process for scheduling **Communion Servers** for the rest of 2022. An email blast has gone out seeking volunteers to fill remaining slots. Reminder: *Any ordained Elder or Deacon is eligible to serve communion* so if you are eligible but have not yet signed up to serve, you are encouraged to **sign up** in the Hospitality Room or call the church office.
- Pastor Kim has been <u>invited to apply</u> to the Wabash Leadership Program, and a <u>motion</u> encouraging her to submit an application was unanimously approved.
- The church is in need of a <u>Wedding Coordinator</u>. A job description will be created for this volunteer position, and if anyone in the congregation is interested, please contact Church Administrator Dawn Scarborough in the office. It is possible that job descriptions could also be created for a <u>Funeral Director</u> and a <u>Kitchen Coordinator</u>, if anyone is interested.

Motions

Finance & Stewardship Team

- Upon recommendation of the Finance Team and with the consent of those named, <u>appoint</u> Elizabeth Monroe, Bruce Roth, Doug Hollar, Trish Lawson, Chris Hoham, Jim Hubbard, and a member from Mission as Session's Taskforce to initiate planning the process (including possible consultants, scope and priorities) and make recommendations to Session concerning a <u>Capital Campaign</u>. (<u>Approved</u>)
- ➤ <u>Approve</u> actions recommended by Finance Team concerning the Chart of Accounts and <u>approve</u> the financial reports as recorded in its Minutes of April 13, 2022, and shown in current reports. (<u>Approved</u>)

Congregational Life Team

Following discussion and rationale, Motion was made, seconded, and approved to create a **Community** Garden on church property.

iEngage Team

Asking permission to use \$1,180 from account number 8233 to purchase two (2) new – Shure GLX-D hand-held wireless <u>vocal</u> <u>mics</u> and associated hardware. Although this fund is designated for "SIGN," most of the residual funds in the account are from a single large donation made in August of 2016 which was designated "for sign and mic's." (Approved)

Chancel Visioning Team

- Accept the contract proposed by Erich Thompson Sacred Spaces and the current designs, noting that further fine-tuning is expected as his work moves forward. Contract pricing is valid for 60 days. (Approved)
- ➤ <u>Dedicate</u> finance account 8-206 Sacred Space and its balance of \$5,000 given with the intent to implement the visioning work of the CVT, and invite contributions to this account from the congregation for this suite of chancel furniture as a special project, outside the current budget and other reserve funds, and prior to final plans for capital improvements. Down payment of \$13,800 will accompany the signed contract when returned on an expected contract price of \$34,500 for all pieces. (Approved)
- Publicize the vision and drawings to the congregation through the efforts of the Chancel Visioning Team, including a Minute for Mission, Tidings, Facebook and other venues with the help of iEngage that describes the intent for this special project to refresh our worship space and add a visible sign of vibrancy as we envision our worship and congregational life for years to come. (Approved)

SESSION SYNOPSIS OF MAY 18, 2022

The highlight of this May meeting was a visit by **Emily Golding** as one of two confirmands this year. Teachers Ken and Heather Crews presented Emily following her completion of the two-year Confirmation Class, and she shared her Statement of Faith. (Many of you may have also been blessed to hear Emily *and* **Aiden Andrews** share during Worship on Confirmation Sunday, May 22.) Usually, Elders will then question a confirmand, but instead they expressed admiration and appreciation for Emily's wisdom and her ability to not just parrot back what adults want to hear but rather express exactly where she is on her faith journey. She was unanimously approved for membership and enthusiastically welcomed into our congregation. (Aiden was unable to attend this Session meeting but participated in the Worship service and will meet with Session at a future date for acceptance into membership.)

A second highlight was the presentation of a nearly final draft of the **MIF Report** which the Associate Pastor Nominating Committee will send out to potential pastor candidates. Co-Moderators Cathy Greenawald and Jim Hubbard opened the floor for discussion after which Session approved the report and instructed the APNC to move forward with the next step of the process, submitting the report to Presbytery.

Elder Training included discussion of another question asked during ordination: Do you accept the Scriptures to be, by the Holy Spirit, the witness to Jesus Christ in the Church universal, and God's Word to you? Elders reminisced about their first Bibles (many were King James version); about what they have learned about God from Scripture (God literally speaks to us but through metaphors); and how their understanding of Scripture has deepened throughout their faith journeys (Scripture is a living, growing, ever-changing document that meets us where we are at any given moment).

Jessica Young-Brust (our Taskforce coach for the past two years) as facilitator for a Session retreat and congregational conversations about what it means to be a vibrant congregation during these transitional times. (<u>Approved</u>)
- Approve actions recommended by Finance Team concerning the Chart of Accounts and approve the financial reports as recorded in its Minutes of May 11, 2022, and shown in current reports. (Approved)



MATTHEW 25 REFLECTION



"MATTHEW 25 REFLECTION" presents information chosen by our Matthew 25 Team to inform and inspire our church family to actively engage in activities and with initiatives that reduce poverty and racism in our local communities and beyond.

MATTHEW 25

In April, we looked at the inequalities that exist today in Housing and Home Ownership because of the Structural Racism that still exists in the way business, political, and societal interactions play out. One of the factors noted was the practice of **Redlining.** When the ght to make mortgages more affordable back in the 1930s, thereby jumpstarting suburban

government sought to make mortgages more affordable back in the 1930s, thereby jumpstarting suburban living, the Homeowners Loan Corporation ranked neighborhoods giving high marks to all-white neighborhoods and marking those with minorities in red as risky investments. This practice, called **Redlining**, essentially eliminated most black people and other minorities from owning homes and building wealth. **Officially outlawed in the '60s**, the practice of redlining in the housing market has really never gone away. This news article provides a current example.

"Redfin Settles Housing Discrimination Suit." by Nicholoas K. Geranios (Associated Press: April 29, 2022/condensed)

Fair housing advocates on Friday announced a settlement agreement to resolve a lawsuit filed in Seattle federal court against real estate brokerage Redfin. Redfin operates in 95 markets in the U.S. and Canada and has generated \$195 billion in home sales.

The lawsuit alleged Redfin's minimum home price policy violated the Fair Housing Act by discriminating against sellers and buyers of homes in communities of color. NFHA and the other plaintiffs alleged that policies that limit or deny services for homes priced under certain values can perpetuate racial segregation and contribute to the racial wealth gap.

In the lawsuit, Redfin was accused of systematic racial discrimination by offering fewer services to homebuyers and sellers in minority communities — a type of digital redlining that has depressed home values and exacerbated historic injustice in the housing market.

The housing organizations said that during a two-year investigation they documented that under the "minimum price policy," Redfin was vastly less likely to offer realtor services, professional photos, virtual tours, online promotion or commission rebates for homes listed in overwhelmingly minority neighborhoods than it was in overwhelmingly white ones. Full services were not offered unless homes were listed for certain prices, which varied by market. When potential buyers clicked on homes that fell below those minimums, they received a message saying, "Redfin is currently unable to show this property."

That meant homes in minority neighborhoods were likely to stay on the market longer and sell for lower prices, the lawsuit said.

Under the agreement, Redfin will change its minimum price policy, increase racial diversity in in its workforce, advertise to reach non-white consumers, require agents to attend fair housing training, and pay \$4 million. Redfin stated that it preferred to spend money on fair housing than on litigation, and the settlement agreement was not an admission of liability.

FINANCE AND STEWARDSHIP NEWS

FINANCE AND STEWARDSHIP UPDATE JANUARY THROUGH MID-MAY 2022

IN APRIL, our giving provided:

- \$28,766 for the operating fund
- \$432 for our capital fund

Total expenses through April remain under-budget but exceed income by \$10,285 in the operating fund and \$6,346 in the capital fund

And so far this year by mid-May (YTD):

- \$26,693 includes gifts dedicated for The Second Mile monthly mission, Presby's, Presbytery Weekly Nursery School ("PWNS"), youth mission trips, Congregational Life's mission fund, major contributions for disaster assistance, and other mission projects
- \$12,955 toward the Sacred Space chancel furniture
- ◆ Annual distribution from our endowment funds managed by the Porter County Community Foundation provides \$12,929 allocated among music and supplies, mission & ministry, and scholarships; plus \$6,175 for our operating fund.

WHAT DOES THIS TELL US?

- Look and listen to what we are doing with our pastors and worship leaders, Christian educators, pianists and organist, choirs of bells and voices, instrumentalists with cello, violin or bongos, maintenance and repair team, tech leadership, administrators
- Celebrate what our generosity gives to others, like bikes with locks and helmets to reward good students, disaster assistance for a Kentucky church, or to relieve suffering from global disasters, war, weather or poverty, or reuse/recycle with resale items
- Consider our expectation that this is a transitional year, moving from pandemic-mode into its unknown financial consequences. Our pledged giving continues to exceed commitments because some have chosen to give above-and-beyond. Others who chose not to specify their giving in 2022 with a pledge are giving with generosity. Still others are considering whether they could increase their giving. Many faith-filled people give generously of their energy and vision and get things done, serving others.
- We are welcoming more new members and seeing more visitors
- We have flexible options to financially support our ministry, including some new ways, whether weekly, monthly, annually or ad hoc

- Reserve funds have sustained our ministry and helped maintain our buildings and grounds these past couple of difficult years, primarily given through estate gifts arranged by those who came before us.
- We heard it from the Sending after the Sermon about *Come to Jesus*: "Take time to remember the incredible gifts we have been given, a table and feast of grace for all, and give thanks!"
