On Giving a Speech...

At the most recent event in the Mueller family, that of the marriage of our daughter Ashley to a young man by the name of Seth Powell, I was asked to give a five minute speech after the wedding vows.

It was a privilege to be asked to speak at this special occasion. The setting would be a brunch served at an incredible house nestled in the hills of Gainesville, Georgia amid 75 acres of pine and magnolia trees.

The vows were now complete and the rings exchanged. This simple, sacred ceremony was a moving time of commitment and romance. Now about thirty of us had assembled around a large table on an enormous balcony overlooking a large Georgia lake. People had eaten a light brunch of eggs, scones and fruit and it was time for the speeches and toasts.

The Powell family went first. I was thankful. Each presenter was unique telling different stories about the groom that were interesting, embarrassing and revealing.

Then it came time for me to speak. I was tasked with talking about the bride.

I wondered how I would do. How would a father feel at the wedding of a daughter? I had done this before with my older daughter Lauren. However that setting, time, place was different. I thought I would struggle as I did when Lauren was married. I had to speak at that occasion as well. I mean what does a father say in five minutes of a person you have known for their whole life?

After wrestling with the emotions and feelings of the day for several weeks I decided to begin with the words, "Ashley, I love you!" That said it all for me. I had made a vow to each of my daughters that they would hear those words from me every day for their entire life. I said it to them before bedtime every night when they were little. I say it to them after a phone call every time I talk with them these days. I am probably no different than you. "I love you!" says it all.

However, the rest of the group at the brunch wanted a whole lot more. I thought they would. So I proceeded to talk about Ashley as I saw her. I left my funny bone at home (at my daughter's request) and just talked about the little girl who had now become the bride of the day.

I used the first letters of her name to describe Ashely to others.

"A" is for Articulate. Ashley is one of the better writers that I know. She was not given that gift from me, but she is a fantastic writer and speaker.

"S" is for Sporty. Ashley does a lot of things athletically. She runs, bikes, swims and plays Ultimate Frisbee. Recently, she talked me into entering a half triathlon in May of 2018.

"H" is for Heart. Ashley is so passionate. Her heart is huge, especially for the down and out.

"L" is for Lord. Ashley loves the Lord. She prays and reads the Bible and talks with God every day. She is a follower of Jesus.

"E" is for Excellence. Ashley strives to do everything in the best possible way. She does not settle for second-best easily.

"Y" is for yellow. The color yellow captures Ashley's personality for me. She is bright and happy in her approach to life.

With that my five minute speech was finished. Shortly thereafter we were off to the wedding reception.

All of us are called from time to time to give a speech. I don't know how well I did, but I was happy to make it through it.

On the way back to Indiana after the wedding, I was reading through the Book of Acts. Ironically, I read about the times that the Apostle Paul had to make a speech. Read Acts 25 and 26 when you have some time. Paul's speech in those chapters is before officials that are determining if Paul should be put to death. The ruling religious elite want Paul executed. So Paul talks about his conversion on the road to Damascus and then proceeds to talk about his call to proclaim the good news of the Gospel to the Gentiles.

Paul gives many speeches in the Bible. Sometimes he speaks in the temple or before Roman officials. Sometimes Paul speaks before angry crowds. Each time, though, Paul speaks about what he believed to be true in his heart. Paul spoke from the heart.

Paul loved the Lord, and he did not turn away from any occasion to let others know God sent His only Son to die on the cross.

Paul preached Christ and Christ crucified.

In reflecting upon all the recent events in my life and in reading the Bible, I am coming to the conclusion that speaking from the heart brings life to me. We can talk facts, information and chronology of events to fill our minds. That is good too, but nothing quite connects for me like words shared from the heart.

Perhaps the same could be said of you.



Session Synopsis of October 23, 2017

One of the highlights of this Session meeting was the examination of the 2018 Elders which the congregation elected earlier this month. We heard the very moving Statements of Faith of these called servants (Brad Dirks, Elizabeth Monroe, Andrea Phillips, and Chip Wilkes), and you can be assured that you will be in good hands with this newest class of Elders.

Another highlight was a presentation by Mike Becker from the Worship Team. He offered thoughts on various hospitality issues in our church, wondering whether we are organized for radical hospitality. He acknowledged that our pastors are very strong in their preaching and their practice of hospitality on Sunday mornings, but this alone cannot turn our hospitality radical. Therefore, the Worship Team recommended (and Session enthusiastically approved and endorsed) the formation of a Task Force to prayerfully seek the Holy Spirit's guidance as they study the elements of hospitality and seek more effective ways to organize. Members of several Teams will comprise this Task Force, including Worship (Mike Becker), Congregational Life (Leila Buford), and members of Building Disciples and Mission Teams. If anyone in the congregation is interested in participating on the Task Force, please contact Mike or Leila and join the discussion.

Pastor Mark distributed Communion Team assignments for 2018 with a slightly modified schedule. Worship Team had initially decided (and Session had approved) for a number of reasons to alternate monthly Communion by Intinction at the 9:00 service. That decision has been modified to serve by Intinction during the summer months as well as on holiday and/or single service Sundays. This will also make preparation and clean-up by the Deacons much more manageable. Worship Team also recommended that a single morning worship service be held on December 24 plus two Christmas Eve services at 4:00 p.m. and 7:00 p.m. with the Praise Band playing at the 7:00 p.m. service.

Much other business came before Session, including the following:

- 1. Session granted approval to allow Pastor Mark to write a grant for Malawi Matters for the Presbytery of Wabash Valley.
- 2. Jim Hubbard has volunteered to create a Manual of Administrative Operations as required by Presbytery.
- 3. <u>Finance</u> presented a draft of the 2018 Budget which will hopefully be approved at the November Session meeting and presented to the Congregation in January.
- 4. <u>Building & Grounds</u> presented an ongoing urgent issue with the pillar on the northwest corner of the sanctuary and was given permission to pursue an appropriate course of action.
- 5. Congregational Life is excited to partner with Worship and Christian Education Teams for the <u>Hanging of the Greens</u> following a single service on December 3, 2017. Activities are planned for the children, a soup luncheon will be served, and all will help prepare the sanctuary for the Advent season.
- 6. <u>Personnel</u> reported exceptional staff evaluations, salary increases for staff, and approval of Terms of Call for the pastors (which will be reported at the January Annual Meeting).

Israel/Palestine/Jordan Mission-Vision Trip

Join Associate Director Marilyn Borst and visit Outreach's strategic partners: Bethlehem Bible College, Palestinian Bible Society and Musalaha (a reconciliation ministry) to learn of their work and witness. We will also meet with other Palestinian Christian ministries to learn how they are seeking to be faithful under pressure and with peace, a seemingly elusive ideal in this controversial but compelling place.



There will, of course, be ample time to experience the sites of the Biblical narrative and the places where Christ's life and ministry became incarnational, including the Jerusalem area, Bethlehem, Nazareth and the Galilee, as well as Jericho and the Dead Sea. Participants will be expected to absorb assigned readings which will help prepare them to explore the history and politics of a contested land and to wrestle with the often-distorted theologies which have skewed our understanding of what the Bible teaches us about that land and the divine covenants (in both the Old and New Testaments) which were formed in that crucible.



We will also spend some days in Jordan visiting the refugee ministries of Middle East Council of Churches, who, through their Orthodox Initiative, are bringing hope and healing to both Syrian and Iraqi refugees. We will spend time with the students and staff of the Holy Land Institute for the Deaf where, for 50 years, this Anglican boarding school has dispensed both loving care and quality education. There will be an add-on option to see Petra.

Endowment Committee News

Unlock the Value of Your Appreciated Stock

"Planned Giving" is usually defined as making charitable gifts that require planning before they are made. Planning involves more than deciding the amount that an individual wishes to give or a cause one wishes to support. By planning the type of gift, one may be able to make a significantly larger gift by simply utilizing Federal and State tax provisions for charitable giving.

Consider this example. Mr. and Mrs. Generous have a heart for helping others and want to make a gift to the Mission and Ministry Fund of their church's Endowment. The Generous family is also very techsavvy and started investing in Apple stock in the early 1990s. Since then, Apple stock has greatly appreciated. If they sell any shares of this stock in order to make a donation to the church, they will have to pay substantial capital gains taxes.

Fortunately, the Generous' discussed their gift plan with their CPA. She suggested they make the gift of stock *directly* to the church. This way, they would not only avoid the capital gains taxes but still be able to take a tax deduction for the *entire* gift. She also explained how easy it was to give stock *directly* to the church. This guidance resulted in a win-win for both Mr. and Mrs. Generous and for the church since the money that would have gone to capital gains taxes went to the church instead.

Do you have stocks in your portfolio that have performed well but you do not want to sell due to the capital gains taxes that you would owe? Unlock that stock's full value by giving it directly to the church and also qualify for a charitable deduction on your tax return as well. (Publicly traded stocks and cash are the only assets that entitle the donor to charitable deductions based on the Fair Market Value when donated to a nonprofit organization.)
