

#### **Challenges**

A few of you know that my younger daughter, Ashley asked me to join her in a  $\frac{1}{2}$  Ironman. I felt honored to do so. An Ironman is a race involving three events held one right after another. The first part is the swim. An Ironman participant will swim 1.2 miles. Upon exiting the water, the swimmer will ride a bicycle 56 miles. When finished biking, the last part of the race is a 13.1 mile run (a half marathon).

At 57 years of age, the entire race will be a challenge for me. I am grateful that the event takes place in the beautiful city of Chattanooga, Tennessee. I will swim in the Tennessee River, bike the farmlands of south Chattanooga and run the Riverwalk adjacent to downtown Chattanooga. Chattanooga is a scenic place.

A lot of you know that I try and stay fit. Frankly, I just feel better when I do. I enjoy getting out for a quick run or swim. I like a long walk on a nice day. I enjoy a good bike ride as well.

Frankly, I can and have done each of the events in the  $\frac{1}{2}$  Ironman. However, I have not done each of them on the same day right after the other one. That is a challenge because muscles fatigue on any one of the events let alone three of them. Your brain is screaming for you to stop, but that loud voice has to be ignored. That is a challenge.

I have to eat during the race. Fuel is important for the body to function effectively. I need to pay attention to my potassium, magnesium and sodium levels. If I don't provide fuel for my body or eat the correct type of food, muscles will cramp and it will not be a pretty ending.

This Ironman is going to challenge me. I am facing an obstacle. Part of me wonders if I can do it. Yet, in thinking more about this, I am confident because I have faced other challenges and have overcome them. I completed the Rocket City Marathon three years ago. I ran 26.2 miles in four hours and thirty-seven minutes. I have faced career challenges, family challenges and spiritual ones as well. We all face challenges.

Some of us have faced challenges in our childhood, like me. Some of us were abandoned and abused. Others have faced parents with unrealistic expectations. We never felt good enough. Some of us still don't feel a sense of worth. Others face incredible obstacles right now. I think of people who face the challenge of a neurological disease. I think of those faced with a child who is addicted to drugs. I marvel at those that must deal daily with aging parents. I have a friend and colleague with congestive heart failure. I think of those who live in fear as they watch the news each day. Life is not for the faint of heart. It is a challenge.

How do we face these challenges?

One of my favorite theologians is Dietrich Bonhoeffer. I have read most of his books and plenty of others about his life. Eric Metaxis' book is the best I have read about Bonhoeffer (Bonhoeffer: Pastor, Martyr, Prophet, Spy)

Bonhoeffer lived in a very challenging time, during World War II. He was a young pastor with a brilliant mind. He loved people, and he loved preaching the Gospel. Yet as Adolf Hitler rose to power, Hitler wanted to nationalize the church. Bonhoeffer was ardently opposed.

Bonhoeffer faced the incredible challenge of being the voice of Christ in a very dark time. Yet he was resilient to the very end. He met the challenge. As the Nazi troops led Bonhoeffer to his execution, Bonhoeffer sang hymns of praise.

Bonhoeffer faced his challenge head on. He did so in the context of a wonderful prayer life. He found his support in Jesus Christ.

I know that we can certainly turn to the secular world for help as we face our challenges. I have loved material published in <u>Psychology Today</u>. When faced with obstacles/challenges, psychologists encourage us to:

- 1. Turn toward reality
- 2. Embrace life as it is rather than as you wish it to be
- 3. Be patient
- 4. Practice generosity
- 5. Pay attention to your feelings
- 6. Accept success and failure as part of life
- 7. Cultivate loving relationships

I love the suggestions. I fine them helpful.

Yet some of those techniques for handling the challenges and obstacles of life have not worked for me. Eventually, I get frustrated and depressed. Over the years, the only thing I have found that works is prayer. God, through His Son Jesus Christ is the answer to all of my needs.

One way I have been able to conquer marathons and difficult challenges over the years is to pray about it. I recall key Scripture passages. Actually when I run, swim, or bike, I refer to Paul's words in his letter to the Philippians. I say some words over and over again as I race and train, "I can do all things through Christ who strengthens me."

As you face your challenges in life, remember always to pray. Remember always that you can do all things through Christ.

## Session Synopsis of April 16, 2018

It is mid-April, and while we anxiously await spring, we are nevertheless faced with cold and cloudy days. As noted by Lou Ann Karabel in her opening devotions and prayer, we are thirsty for light and warmth in this seemingly endless winter. She began our meeting with a recording (and encouraged us to join in the singing!) by Carrie Newcomer entitled "Lean in Toward the Light" which begins, "Winter is the oldest season/But quietly beneath the snow/Seeds are stretching out and reaching/Faithful as the morning glow."

This was a special meeting as Elders were joined by members of the Board of Deacons in this annual joint meeting (which is prescribed by the Book of Order). Deacons were welcomed and commended for the significant work they perform for our church. They DO have a huge impact and were applauded for their service.

Since Pastor Mark was at a conference, Pastor Toby moderated the meeting. Several motions were approved, including:

a CE fundraiser by VBS (Vacation Bible School) to collect coins for Living Waters for the World, which trains and equips volunteer mission teams to partner with communities in need of clean water around the world;

- moving Communion in May from May 6 to May 13 for both services to accommodate the Puppet Ministry performing on May 6;
- planning a blended service on July 1 in the Pavilion, followed by group fellowship;
- receiving reports from Building & Grounds, Building Disciples, CE, Endowment, iEngage, Worship, both Clerks, the Treasurer, and the Pastor; and
- if the way be clear, Building Disciples was given permission to invite poet, essayist, lyricist, and folk artist Carrie Newcomer (we listened to her song during opening devotions!) to present a concert and workshop at our church in September.

Pastor Toby then invited everyone present to share where we have seen God at work recently. Elders and Deacons shared many wonderful stories including:

- God's presence at the new LIFT intergenerational gatherings the past two Sundays;
- God's presence in Kenya presented by Ken McAloon about his recent mission trip;

- God's presence in nature: a beautiful sunrise, a family of deer, a stray cat;
- God's presence in others offering help in unexpected places and ways (putting out fires, changing tires, providing gas, removing overgrown shrubs);
- God's presence in our congregation: sharing, welcoming, inviting, listening; and
- ➢ God's presence in healings.

Pastor Toby closed the meeting by thanking God for being with us in each of these situations and by asking all to continue to look for God's presence in our daily lives and to continue to share the stories of His presence with others.

#### Summer Events for Christian Opportunities




Vacation Bible School Is Happening in June.

Browsing the Church Library Pastor Nancy Becker

I want to recommend spending some time in one of the great treasure of our church, which is our church library. Our late Sister-in-Christ Georgia Coyle devoted her later years to making it into a marvelous place for inspiration, information and entertainment. There are all kinds of books: theological and biblical reference books, Bible commentaries, devotional guides, high level Christian fiction, prayer books and much, much more.

Just to pique your interest I call your attention to a few books that might be something that you would like to look at.

"<u>Mockingbirds and Angel Songs</u>" by Jo Carr and Imogene Sorley is one of my all-time favorite guides to prayer and meditation. These two women write short daily prayers out of their lives that sing with authenticity and honesty. The prayers offer the women's ordinary daily experiences that they simply talk over with God. I found that almost every prayer resonated with my own life and my faith journey.

"<u>The Family of Jesus</u>" by Karen Kingsbury is joy for those of us who like fictional imaginings about the people of the Bible. Kingsbury is a master at this kind of literature. In vivid and dramatic detail, she brilliantly imagines the lives of those closest to Jesus: Joseph, Mary, Zechariah, Elizabeth, James, John the Baptist. In this book these people come alive as we think about their lives and how they were changed by Jesus. The book also includes discussion guides that would be suitable for Bible study groups. (232.9)

"<u>Bible Plants for American Gardens</u>" by Eleanor Anthony King. As spring brings out the gardener in many of us, it is fun to browse through this book in which King imparts both horticultural and theological insight into the common trees and flowers and herbs in our yards and gardens. For example, apples are mentioned in the Old Testament, but King contends that the fruit so translated was probably an apricot. Or the well-known bulrushes in which Moses was hidden is also known as the papyrus plant which, down through the ages, has been the basis of paper. This is an enjoyable book to browse through. (229.8)

#### Aug 7: Fly

- Aug 8: Arrive in Tel Aviv. Visit the port city of Jaffa St. Peter Church and the story of Peter in the house of Simon the Tanner. Transfer to Jerusalem to the hotel.
- Aug 9: Start the day with a pilgrimage visit to Mount of Olives with a panoramic view over the city of Jerusalem. Walk the Palm Sunday path from the Pater Noster Church to the garden of Gethsemane. Visit the Wailing Wall, the most holy site for the Jews all over the world. Stop at the Israeli museum where you can see the model of Jerusalem at the time of Jesus (Jerusalem second temple period) and the shrine of the book the place where you can learn about the Dead Sea scrolls. End the day in the village of Ein Karem. See the Church of the visitation and the birth place of St. John the Baptist.
- Aug 10: Leave Jerusalem towards southern city of Bethlehem (West Bank, Palestinian Authority). Drive through the check point and the separation wall. Visit the Monastery of the Shepherds Fields, where the angel of the Lord appeared to the shepherds announcing the birth of Jesus. Visit the Nativity Church, the birth place of the Lord, and St. Catherine Catholic Church. Mission to Bethlehem University, Bethlehem Bible College and/or Wiam, tour a refugee camp.
- Aug 11: Drive to the wilderness to visit Masada, Herod's most amazing desert fortress. Then drive to Qumran to visit the remains of the settlement and the caves where the Dead Sea scrolls were found. Stop at the Dead Sea for a float in this unique salty lake. (And enjoy a drink at the world's lowest elevation bar, if you want!).
- Aug 12: Early morning start with a walk in Jerusalem in the Old City. Walk the way of the cross and visit the Holy Sepulcher Church. This is the place of the crucifixion and the tomb of our Lord Jesus Christ. Attend the English speaking Sunday worship in the Lutheran Church of the Redeemer. Then proceed to Mount Zion to visit the last supper room and the church of St. Peter in Galicantu.
- Aug 13: Today we concentrate on the Biblical City of Jerusalem and the Temple Mount area. Visit the city of David. Southern steps. Western Wall and the Western Wall tunnel.
- Aug 14: Leave Jerusalem towards the coastal plain and visit the remains of Cesarean Maritime, Herod's biggest city, the place where Cornelius the centurion met Simon Peter and believed in Christianity. This is also the place where St. Paul was in prison. On the way to the Sea of Galilee, drive through Nazareth and visit the amazing church of the Annunciation. Overnight in Tiberias by the sea.
- Aug 15: Drive to the Golan Heights to visit the biblical city Dan. Enjoy a walk in the natural park and the biblical remains of Dan. Then drive to Cesarea Philippi, the place where Peter declared Jesus as the Son of God. Overnight in Tiberias by the sea.
- Aug 16: Today we will finalize our pilgrimage concentrating on Jesus's public ministry. We will start our day with a worship by the lake near the church of the Multiplication and the story of feeding the five thousand. Then visit the church of St. Peter Primacy and Jesus appearing to his disciples. See the remains of Capernaum, Jesus's Galilean headquarters, and the Chapel of the Beatitudes. Finalize the day with a boat ride on the Sea of Galilee. Overnight in Tiberias by the sea.
- Aug 17: Early check out and transfer to the airport.

## **Deacons Doings**




