Session Synopsis of October 18, 2023

This month Session welcomed four Elders-Elect into their midst: Jerry Kahrs, Kathryne Penninga, Rose Ross, and Chip Wilkes. Both Jerry and Chip have served previously, but Kathryne and Rose are joining Session for the first time. The Book of Order requires that all be "examined," so current Elders took turns asking questions as conversation starters. Interesting discussion ranged from evangelism to the variety of abilities and skills which will enable these officers to be effective in their new positions. All "passed" easily and were welcomed to their new ministries.

Another exciting development is a continuation of a topic presented in the September Synopsis. **Personnel** presented a detailed job description of a two-year contract for an Associate Pastor in Residence which was unanimously approved. (This would be similar to the agreement we initially had with Pastor Toby Mueller several years ago.) Personnel then presented the outstanding credentials of candidate Julia Zhao whose profile appeared to be exactly what FPCV is looking for. After meaningful discussion, motion was made, seconded, and approved to offer Pastor Julia the position of Associate Pastor in Residence. You will be hearing much more from Personnel, and will hopefully get to meet Pastor Julia very soon.

As you already know, Pastor Kim had a wonderful trip to the southern border provided by the Wabash Leadership Program. She plans to share some of what she learned when she teaches several Faith Formation classes (with pictures!) in the upcoming weeks. This will coincide with the October 28 Fall Forum which is being held at FPCV and concerns similar immigration and border issues, so all are encouraged to attend.

Several important **motions** were considered:

- After an extended two-day period of discussion, the following Email Motion was approved on October 3, 2023: To suspend the motion approved at the September 20, 2023, Session meeting regarding the B & G request to spend \$31,000 for repairs to the Chapel HVAC system. This issue was further discussed, including green energy options such as solar energy panels and possibly becoming an Earth Care congregation. The hope is a decision might be postponed until a more complete picture of all building needs can be obtained without jeopardizing the Chapel project.
- A second Email Motion was approved on October 4, 2023, to approve the application of Emma to serve at the 2024 General Assembly (if she is selected by the nominating committee) as a Young Adult Advisory Delegate (YAAD) with the full support of the Session.
- A third Email Motion was approved on October 12, 2023, to approve the applications of Matthew Byerly and/or Linda Long for the position of Ruling Elder Commissioner from the Presbytery of Wabash Valley (if selected by the nominating committee) to the 226th General Assembly next June 25-July 4, 2024, with the full support of the Session.
- Finance recommended that unbudgeted expenses incurred by the Personnel Team to host the Associate Pastor in Residence candidate be reimbursed from general reserves and recorded as a "special project" #54430-CAND (approved)
- Motion to allow Deacons' Home Communion Ministry to be distributed with Advent Bags in November (approved)
- > Motion to allow a Deacons' fundraiser to sell inspirational calendars at the Connection Table on Sunday mornings following the Craft Fair (not approved)
- Motion to allow Lauren Phillips to raise money for Riley Children's Hospital via a dance marathon (approved)



BLOOD RECIPIENT STORY



In April, Julie was diagnosed with leukemia. She started treatment immediately and was hospitalized for a little over two weeks, receiving chemo and blood product transfusions.

During that first hospital stay, she asked her husband to bring her art supplies. Soon her walls were covered with drawings and paintings. "When I paint, I forget about cancer. I forget about hospital stays, shots and medicines that have side effects. When I paint, I feel so good and so connected to life. I hope that my paintings bring joy and hope to those who see them."

Each month, Julie has a phase in her treatment when her blood cells are the lowest. Usually, she needs multiple platelet transfusions and the occasional blood transfusion.

"Without the platelet donations, I wouldn't be alive. My platelets get so low that any little thing could cause me to bleed to death. It's the number one thing that is saving my life right now. I suppose chemo is helping too, but it also kills [the platelets], so platelets are by far the most important part of my treatment," Julie said.

"I have so many people to love and so many paintings to paint, and I couldn't do any of that without the beautiful platelets from the donors. My heart glows with love and appreciation for those who donate."

FINANCE TEAM NEWS

FINANCIAL UPDATE AS OF SEPTEMBER 30, 2023

Together, we continue to live as a vibrant congregation which shares its generosity!

- Our budgeted giving is on track with \$396,475 received to date, and 25% of our budgeting income to anticipate in October, November and December. Budgeted expenses paid total \$384,265.
- We have received \$136,765 in designated giving for capital projects, 2nd Mile and other mission giving, tuition and gifts to our preschool, scholarships and other specific gifts. We have distributed \$121,660 with the remainder held in specific accounts for later use.
- So far, we have received \$208,205 in gifts to The Sharing Table Project which are invested as we prepare to name our priorities and begin special projects to implement our Sharing Table visions for the future; and
- We can celebrate our rejuvenated Presbyterian Church Resale Shop and its volunteers for deposits of \$8,603 in September, after it reopened September 11th!
