

#### **Lenten Thoughts**

Remember you are dust, and to dust you shall return...

I am writing this on Ash Wednesday, but you will be further into Lent by the time you read this. Still, Lent is always a good time to reflect on who you are, and whose you are. It's even a great time to pick up a new habit, or routine in your life, to help you find balance in your spiritual journey.

To that end, Building Disciples team (which oversees our small group ministry) has purchased, and has available a couple of copies of the following books: *Hallelujah*, *Anyway* – by Anne Lamott, and *Wondrous Encounters: Scriptures for Lent* – by Fr. Richard Rohr. Neither have DVDs, but both are written by amazing authors who speak into the realities of today's life, and offer much fodder for conversation. Even if you aren't in a small group (so please consider joining one! Lists of small groups are available in the Hospitality Center) you may want to add one or both of these to your reading list!

In addition, your daily devotional life is really important. To that end, I'd like to recommend some other resources:

- ➤ Bread and Wine: readings for Lent and Easter Plough Publishing House. A compilation of writers throughout the ages (think Augustine, Buechner, Eckhart, Kierkegaard, Lewis, Merton, and others); 72 readings to take you through the seasons of Lent and Easter.
- ➤ Kneeling in Jerusalem Ann Weems. Poems and prayers for Lent and Easter.
- ➤ Beyond Words Frederick Buechner. Daily devotions for the entire year, culled from his many writings.

Daily Prayer – daily readings and prayers from our Book of Common Worship.



D365 –an app which has a quick reading, and opportunities for thinking and prayer. Designed for teens, and adults



Pray As You Go – very meditative, akin to Lectio Divina. Reads through the daily scripture twice, with time and questions to reflect on the scripture and your life. My personal favorite right now! (plus, the voices are British...)

I am sure there are others out there that you could add to my list! Let us know what your favorites are on our Facebook page! Share with us how you plan to journey through Lent this year!

Finally, don't neglect worship – the basic, foundational need for believers. In addition to Sunday worship, we will again offer a special Palm Sunday experience to begin Holy Week (3/25), and then host a Maundy Thursday service (3/29 - 6:30 p.m.) and Good Friday service (3/30 - noon). Remember, it is important to walk through Holy Week, before you get to Easter!

#### Congregational Meeting Synopsis of January 28, 2018

On Sunday, January 28, 2018, Pastor Mark Mueller called the annual meeting of the congregation to order immediately following the 9:00 a.m. service in the worship space and led the gathering in prayer. Twenty-five minutes of business moved quickly:

- ➤ Minutes of three congregational meetings in 2017 were approved as presented.
- ➤ Jerry Kahrs reviewed the good news of the 2017 financial report, celebrating that the congregation exceeded its pledge commitments for the church. Though some of that giving may be attributable to the changes in tax law for 2018, the finance committee estimates that the generosity of the church contributed about \$15,000 to ministry beyond pledges.
- ➤ The congregation elected Kay Exley, Terrie Colosino, Harry Karabel and Paul Knauff to its nominating committee, and 2017 moderator Lou Ann Karabel thanked those who previously served. Those are Julie Fletcher-Golding, Andrea Phillips, Doug Hollar and Rose Ross.
- As a meeting of the corporation, the congregation affirmed the Session election of Elizabeth Monroe as corporation president, and Doyll Andrews as secretary.
- ➤ The congregation approved the terms of call for Pastor Mark, including a 3% increase from 2017. Session has approved a similar increase in 2018 for Pastor Toby, who is contracted with Session.
- ➤ The Operating Budget for 2018 approved by Session was received as presented by Jerry Kahrs. Session members responded to questions about funding for employee increases as well as capital improvements and essential repairs such as the building pillars.

> Jim Hubbard closed the meeting with prayer.

If you didn't receive a copy of the Annual Report and the 2018 Operating Budget at congregational meeting, copies are available from the office. In the forty-seven pages of the Annual Report you will find reports of the pastors, finances, 2017 congregational meeting minutes, membership clerk, deacons, the many ministry teams doing the daily work of the congregation, and specific ministries including the weekday nursery school and the resale shop. Pastors and Session members welcome your questions.

#### Session Synopsis of February 19, 2018

The Session and guests met on Monday evening, February 19th for conversation and to take action on a few items. Pastor Mark moderated the meeting. Highlights:

Andrea Phillips led devotions by reading from Phil Ressler's "40 Things to Give up for Lent," and closed with prayer.

Session received numerous reports from working teams, and approved requests from the Congregational Life Team:

- 1) Plans for Palm Sunday Brunch on March 25th between church services.
- Use of the Church Pavilion on June 9th from 800 a.m. - 12:00 p.m. for congregational Garage Sale.

Members of Session's Christian Education Task Force reported on its analysis of survey responses from the congregation and invited additional responses. Monica Conrad, Paul Knauff and Pastor Toby Mueller cited aspects of other progress and the expanded scope of their inquiry beyond the congregation to relate to the community. Session discussion acknowledged the need for more cross-communication about mission and ministry among working teams and with the whole congregation. The task force will continue its work toward its recommendations.

At the request of the Personnel Ministry Team and in support of its recruiting efforts, Session approved a \$1 hourly increase in pay for nursery assistants to \$11/hour and for nursery coordinator to \$12/hour.

Session agreed to permit the Valparaiso Family YMCA to use the church parking lot for its April 7th "Ringing in Spring" Run/Walk.

Before closing, Pastor Mark invited each one present to talk about what was on his or her heart or mind. Session listened attentively and occasionally discussed concerns raised, ideas generated, disappointments and celebrations.

Pastor Mark wrapped up the conversation by asking Session to envision "What does God want us to do? Where is the 'God wave' I can catch?" and closed with a circle of prayer at 8:07 p.m.

If you would like more information, please read the detailed minutes that are posted in the glass-enclosed announcement board in the Hospitality Center once they are approved. Also feel free to contact any of the Elders and/or the Clerk if you have questions or are interested in further details.



We may be passing out food, helping with paperwork, putting up tents, guarding gates; escorting POC's, distributing supplies, friendship, listening, etc.
