SESSION SYNOPSIS OF JANUARY 19, 2022

The January Session welcomed the new elders Linda Long, Karen Mitseff, Elizabeth Monroe and Ron Phillips, as they join Session to begin 2022. This first 2022 meeting ran a little over three hours as this initial meeting for 2022 had lots to discuss and to address prior to the Annual Meeting of the Congregation to be held Sunday, January 30, 2022, immediately following the 10:00 a.m. Worship service.

Annual Meeting of the Congregation:

- It was noted that a quorum for the Annual Meeting is 10% of our membership and it will be extremely difficult to have a virtual meeting for those who would prefer to attend virtually.
- Therefore, the Annual Meeting WILL NOT be a Zoom meeting, however, all the materials such as the 2021 Annual Report, the 2022 Budget and Terms of Call for Pastor Kim will be available to be mailed upon request to members not in attendance.
- **Elder Training**: The topic of this month's elder training was very appropriate: The Church and Civil Authority: How our church is structured as a Corporation with Trustees and how it operates. FPCV is a corporation with a President, Secretary, a Treasurer and members. The President and the Secretary of the corporation are elected from among the Trustees who are the elders serving on Session, but that same requirement is not in place for the Treasurer. Each officer serves a one-year term with elections done at the first Session meeting of each year. The members of the corporation are the members of the congregation.
- **Team of the Month: iEngage** {Each month one of the Ministry Teams takes responsibility for describing their work and responsibilities, are prayed for by the other teams and report how that felt, what they learned being in prayer for the wider community + give reflections on worship}.
- > iEngage promotes awareness and visibility of church ministries and activities. It utilizes media of all kinds to promote the church's activities. It oversees the implementation of technology to support all ministry efforts including worship and coordinates with the Administrative Assistant and the Church Office in the use of communication platforms such as: • Tidings • Church Website and Social Media pages • Email communications using Constant Contact various comparable platforms ◆ Worship Bulletins ◆ Church calendar • Zoom meeting platform. iEngage is, in essence, the church's marketing team. It leverages the communication tools the church has to increase awareness of the church and its activities and explore new ways of accomplishing that goal.

Regular Business:

- Accepted were the reports submitted by Ministry Teams, from Staff, approved Minutes of past meetings.
- > Reviewed the church calendar and learned of communications received by the church.
- > Heard reports from those Commissioned Elders who attended the quarterly Assembly meeting of the Presbytery of Wabash Valley on December 2, 2021
- Approved the 2021 Annual Report to be available for the Annual Meeting Jan 30, 2022, which is a very informative and valuable summary of the wonderful work of this congregation within our congregation, within our community and in the world at large. All members should get a copy and spend some time reading and appreciating all that is being done by our teams and by our members. We are truly blessed and actively doing God's work in this world in many ways.
- Accepted the deadline of the February 2022 meeting of Session to review and suggest any changes to the Church Policies that each Ministry Team is responsible for and their applicable Bylaws.

In addition, the following business was conducted:

Motions:

- Finance & Stewardship Team moved: To approve members of the Finance/Stewardship Team to collectively assume the responsibilities of Treasurer of the Corporation pro tem. Approved. {Replacing retiring Treasurer Ruth Dickey is not something to be done in haste and the Job Description and responsibilities are being reviewed and updated to properly reflect the role of the Treasurer to potential candidates. The team members are willing and able to handle this role during the interim period.}
- Finance & Stewardship Team moved: To approve actions taken by the Finance Team to accurately present and cover the cost the Hines Plumbing invoice for installation of the new water pipes in the Education wing of our building from capital funds and not from the Repair & Maintenance operating account. Approved.
- ➤ <u>Corporation Officers for 2022 were elected as follows:</u> President, Sharon Kinsey; Secretary Kim Croarkin and Treasurer Pro Tem the Finance & Stewardship Team collectively.
- After some thoughtful discussion and discerning conversation, the following motion was made and Approved at a Called Special Meeting Sunday January 23: "Ministry units will be supported by Session in their decisions to pause/suspend events, programs or activity in our building for reasons related to safety protocols surrounding COVID. The requirement for all persons in our building to be masked regardless of vaccination status will remain until changed by Session."

 {Our building is used by a variety of groups regularly, and others by specific request, for a wide range of
 - {Our building is used by a variety of groups regularly, and others by specific request, for a wide range of activities, programs and purposes. Each one is somewhat unique and this motion allows for some flexibility based on dates, time, types of activities and the user group involved. Consistency of treatment of those similarly situated is the objective, while appropriately protecting the safety of our members. Session is placing its trust in our own members on these team to make the best decision. A set of Guidelines to be used by the Ministry Units was reviewed and approved at that Special Called Meeting which should assure uniformity of treatment for similarly situated users of our building.}

Informational Items:

- COVID remains a force in our State and the Valparaiso community. Addressing it week to week seems the best approach as circumstances and numbers are constantly changing. This ever-changing landscape of COVID is complicated, confusing and confounding. There has never been any intent to allow the decisions being made to <u>divide us</u>. We are hoping that all discussions and differences of opinion can be handled with <u>grace and understanding</u>... recognizing that the decision-making is not easy.
- Session is aware there is an undercurrent of conversation regarding a possible future Capital Campaign. HOWEVER, Session wants to confirm that before there can be any options presented or discussed, a substantial amount of information-gathering and assessment will need to take place so that there are facts and figures available to start such conversation. Session is engaged in that information-gathering, assessment and evaluation and will not be prepared to move forward until that is complete. Session cannot engage in discussion or conversation until those facts and figures are available. Session can be trusted to keep the congregation fully informed as the research and investigation proceeds. The preliminary work of information gathering and assessment is being led by Session elders who also keep Session informed.

Praises/Joys/Prayers/Concerns:

➤ Prayers were requested for this congregation as we move into a new year that we approach with an attitude of abundance and not one of scarcity. Doing God's work effectively and with generosity and grace will require that.

A STEPHEN MINISTRY STORY A STEADY REMINDER OF GOD'S PRESENCE

Mark and I had been married 26 years. Our sons were 18 and 20. We loved being parents, but with our younger son graduating high school, we were eagerly anticipating the empty nest and having more time for each other. In the fall, when our younger son started college, Mark began having stomach issues and back pain, which would linger for a few days and then disappear, only to reappear later. He also developed a cough. When his doctor ordered an MRI, the results were devastating—Stage IV pancreatic cancer, already in his liver and both lungs. Mark was only 53. Our lives were turned upside down. I suddenly found myself trying to provide emotional support to Mark and our sons during the worst experience any of us had ever endured. I wanted and needed to keep myself together to focus on caring for Mark, but I was emotionally drained—full of sadness and terrified of what the future held. I had always been a "take responsibility for everything myself" kind of person. However, I knew I couldn't do this alone. I talked to my pastor about it, and she suggested matching me with a Stephen Minister. I agreed, and less than two weeks after Mark was diagnosed, my Stephen Minister came for the first of her weekly visits. It's difficult to convey how important this Stephen Ministry relationship was for me. Our pastor was wonderful, and we had an amazing amount of support from many other people, but the time I spent with my Stephen Minister was the only time in the week when I could truly focus on my own needs. She was there just for me. My Stephen Minister let me know that, while she was very concerned for Mark, her role was to be my support—to listen and help me process what I was feeling and going through, without giving advice or telling me what to do. The consistency of our Stephen Ministry relationship was crucial in helping me cope. Her weekly visits became an anchor in my life something I could rely on when everything else was so uncertain. She was a steady reminder of God's presence, helping me know I was never alone. The time I spent with my Stephen Minister was the only time in the week when I could truly focus on my own needs. She was there just for me. Although Mark and I chose to talk publicly about his condition, my Stephen Ministry relationship was completely confidential. I knew I could share anything with her, and that's where it would stay. Mark's illness progressed rapidly—ten weeks of treatment, followed by six weeks of hospice, and then his passing. My needs changed as I went from being a wife to being a caregiver to being a grieving widow and dealing with everything that the loss of a spouse entails. Through it all, my Stephen Minister's love and support continued. She was there for me at every stage of my journey. It was never easy, but my Stephen Minister helped me through the most difficult moments of my life. I really can't say enough about how much I appreciate my church's Stephen Ministry. The compassionate, consistent, and confidential support of my Stephen Minister was so important in helping me cope—and then begin to heal. Her weekly visits became an anchor in my life—something I could rely on when everything else was so uncertain. She was a steady reminder of God's presence, helping me know I was never alone.

Faith Formation for *Everyone*! Sunday mornings @ 9am

As we welcome in another year, the FPCV Faith Formation Team is pleased to announce that we continue to offer Sunday morning classes for all ages at FPCV. Classes are organized into Early Childhood (3/4yo-Kindergarten), Elementary (1st-3rd grade), BOCA (4th-6th grade), Confirmation (7th/8th grade), High School (9th-12th grade), AND Adult.

Faith Formation classes this spring will continue exploring the PCUSA's *Follow Me* curriculum. *Follow Me*: *Biblical Practices for Faithful Living* is a curriculum based on practices Jesus did and taught us to do as faithful followers. Written for people of all ages who wish to live out their faith, this new curriculum examines where these practices are found in the Bible and how they have been used in Christian faith then and now.

Is it Christian Education or Faith Formation?



You may be noticing a shift in language at FPCV. Programs, classes, and events that have traditionally been identified as Christian Education are increasingly being named Faith Formation offerings. But why the change?

Christian Education has a rich history in many mainline churches, including FPCV, while others have used the language of Faith Formation for some time. History has the power to imbue certain words and titles with meaning; sometimes this is helpful and sometimes it becomes limiting. For some, the language of Christian Education implies a limited scope of activities, occurring in specific places, with a particular group. We believe the language of Faith Formation can help free the community to explore our faith in new and expansive ways.

Faith Formation embraces a more holistic approach to developing the Christian life. Faith Formation is at the heart of what the Christian life is all about. In many ways, we engage in the practices of our daily lives and the rituals of our faith communities—through worship, mission, working for justice and peace, evangelism, and education—so that our faith may be nurtured, enlivened, sustained, and formed.

We can understand Faith Formation to be "an engaged process of learning and practice integrated throughout all aspects of congregational and daily life." This definition highlights the initiative and action we must take in our own faith formation.*

We hope you'll join FPCV on the Faith Formation journey!

MATTHEW 25 REFLECTION



"MATTHEW 25 REFLECTION" presents information chosen by our Matthew 25 Team to inform and inspire our church family to actively engage in activities and with initiatives that reduce poverty and racism in our local communities and beyond.

Most of us believe we are not racist. We feel that we treat people of color with kindness and respect. We **easily recognize** and speak out against racist **individuals** who act out through cross burning, hate crimes, or racist rhetoric.

However, we do not easily recognize the structural racism that is woven into every aspect of society. Structural Racism is the many racial inequalities that result from American systems and policies that we have always accepted without question.

The best way to gain an understanding of Structural Racism is by looking at the inequalities it produces. Having examined inequalities of wealth, this month we continue by looking at the vast inequalities in **Education.**

- Segregation *within* cities is about the same as in the 1980s. It's still extremely high. 43% of Hispanics and 38% of blacks are in intensely segregated schools.
- Residential segregation between cities is getting worse, and the Supreme Court in the 1974 case *Milliken v. Bradley* said <u>surrounding cities could not be forced into school integration</u> plans.
- We are increasingly isolating poor black and Hispanic children in segregated schools, both public and charter.
- Minorities have less access to rigorous math and science classes and are taught by lower paid teachers with less experience.
- Segregated schools have lower levels of educational resources and per-student spending and higher levels of neighborhood violence, crime, and poverty.
- Black students are 3x more likely to be suspended than white students, even when their infractions are similar.
- Overall, black students represent 16% of student enrollment and 27% of students referred to law enforcement.
- The median white college grad family has 5x more wealth than the median Hispanic family and 6x more than the median black family. (2016)

As we read, study, and discuss Matthew 25 issues, we need God's help in fully recognizing the injustice and inequality that continues to exist because of systemic poverty and structural racism. Please add your voice daily in asking that God guide us and empower us, individually and as a church family, in our Matthew 25 efforts. We also need His help in finding meaningful ways for us to act in response to our love and concern.

Prayer in response to today's article:

Lord, lead and direct my thoughts as I reflect upon the inequalities in education within our nation. Amen.
