# SESSION SYNOPSIS OF APRIL 21, 2021

The question that is on most of our minds right now is *WHEN ARE WE GOING TO RETURN TO WORSHIP IN THE* **SANCTUARY???** Our Community Task Force has been meeting regularly, working so hard for more than a year now, and they are faithfully following science and CDC guidelines. At the last Session meeting, it was their recommendation that Session proceed to return to in-person worship (FOLLOWING ALL CDC GUIDELINES) as soon as it is feasible. That means that your Worship Team is continuing to work diligently to make all the accommodations that will be necessary for us to do that. There are an unbelievable number of logistical issues to solve and still remain within those CDC guidelines! But they are working through them as quickly and as responsibly as they can in order to keep everyone in our congregation safe. Please watch your emails for developments as they are announced!

Thank goodness for technology! Not only has Session been meeting via Zoom for over a year now, but they also have been conducting a great deal of business via email! Any time an important issue comes up that needs to be decided before the next regularly scheduled Session meeting, Elders can take a 24-hour period to discuss the issue and then take a vote. In order for such a vote to be approved, 2/3 of the Elders must agree or it doesn't pass. (Thus, we need 9 Elders to approve an email vote.) Session had **four** of these email votes within the past couple of weeks:

- Approved the "SadderDay" service the day between Good Friday and Easter Sunday;
- Approved a return to regular in-person outdoor worship at 10:00 a.m. in the pavilion beginning on April 11, 2021;
- Approved two food truck fundraisers for The Caring Place who asked to use our parking lot on April 29, and May 25, 2021;
- Approved a "Junk in the Trunk" fundraiser in the pavilion for P.E.O. (Philanthropic Educational Organization) June 19, 2021
- Session also heard presentations from three different subcommittees that have been working for varying lengths of time on major undertakings for FPCV:
- Associate Pastor Nominating Committee ~ Co-Moderators Cathy Greenawald and Jim Hubbard brought Session up-to-date on the work this committee has been doing since its election in late January. They are currently preparing a survey to be sent to the congregation. This should result in an accurate reflection of what our membership thinks and feels so that we can present this to candidates if it is determined that we indeed do wish to seek an associate pastor.

### SESSION SYNOPSIS OF APRIL 21, 2021, CONTINUED

- Chancel Visioning Team ~ Jason Adams and Linda Long presented an update of the work that has been done by their team and Elevate Studio. Elders liked what they saw as far as redesigns of our current worship space, so they voted to direct the CVT to continue the work of finding the best ways to enhance our worship experience.
- Manual of Operations ~ Jim Hubbard reviewed the rationale behind having such a manual (as required by Presbytery) and requested that Moderators review their documents and procedures so that in the event that someone new had to take over their positions, the job description would be clearly explained.

Other business included the following:

- Matthew 25 Team is currently focusing on education. They will be offering a 6-week study through Christian Education and encouraged all Elders to attend, set up a separate study group, or do an independent study so they would also be informed. The study is from the PC(USA) titled "Facing Racism: A Vision of the Intercultural Community Antiracism Study Guides."
- There will be a Called Meeting of Session on Sunday, May 2, 2021, following the 10:00 a.m. Worship Service for the purpose of hearing the Statements of Faith of the Confirmands who will be joining the church on Pentecost Sunday, May 23, 2021.
- Although long-time Business Manager Beverlee Frazee has requested that there be no celebration surrounding her retirement after more than 30 years, Session would still very much like to honor her. A card shower has been suggested, and anyone wishing to say thank-you to Beverlee is encouraged to donate gift cards in her honor.
- Building & Grounds Team appreciated all the prayers of Elders throughout the month (as part of the Holy Living project), but the question proposed was: do we pray for the B & G Team or do we pray for the *boilers* which are 49 years old and in a continual state of needing repair? Continued prayers will be needed as we move forward with the antiquated system.
- Congregational Life received approval for a Garage Sale/Car Wash fundraiser on June 12, 2021. Proceeds from the sale will support New Creation Resale Shop and Men's Center. Details will be upcoming.

Closing Joys and Concerns were shared as all look forward to returning to in-person worship.

If you would like more information, please read the detailed minutes which will be *posted in the glass-enclosed announcement board* in the Hospitality Center once they are approved (and we are allowed back into the church!). **In the meantime**, please contact any of the Elders and/or the Clerk if you have questions or are interested in further details.

# CHANCEL VISIONING TEAM NEWS

At the Session April meeting, the Chancel Visioning Team presented its vision and some preliminary drawings to illustrate:

- Natural light in the sanctuary from a skylight over the chancel and windows in the blank walls high and adjacent to the balcony;
- Flexible, roomy area in the sanctuary equipped for worship music including choirs, bells, piano, band, and other ensembles whether streaming or in-person worship;
- Warm wooden screening design that will enhance room acoustics and worship focus as well as opportunities for arts in worship;
- Lowering the chancel area one step with gentle ramp to improve access for worship leaders; and
- Use the spire and lighting to enhance the witness of our building with its cross and story-telling art glass windows to the neighborhood.

In May, you will have the opportunity to walk through the sanctuary before or after worship in the pavilion for three Sundays (masked, of course) to see posters of preliminary designs we are envisioning with Elevate Studio. We will invite your response with comment cards - aesthetic, spiritual - how does it strike you?

# **ENDOWMENT COMMITTEE**

### IMPORTANT INFORMATION FOR ANYONE WHO CAN CHECK ALL THE BOXES

I am 70 or older.

I have an IRA.

# \_ I donate money to the church (and/or charities).

On our Federal Taxes, most of us now take the <u>standard deduction</u> of \$12,000 (single) or \$24,000 (married) rather than itemizing, and thus we no longer get a tax deduction for money we give to qualified charities. However, if you checked the three boxes above, **you still can donate money and lower your taxes**. Here is why and how:

Beginning at age 70<sup>1</sup>/<sub>2</sub>, you must take a specified amount, your Required Minimum Distribution (RMD), out of your IRA each year. You must now start paying the taxes you avoided when you put the money in the IRA.

Assume Mary is required to take \$3000 out of her IRA this year. She also wants to give \$3000 to the church and/or other charitable organizations.

- 1. She can have this money sent to herself. It is considered income, and she would pay \$1025 more in taxes (if she is in the 32% tax bracket). \$3000-\$1025 (to taxes) = **\$1975 left for charities**
- 2. She can request this money be sent <u>directly</u> to an IRS approved charity, such as the church, and she would pay no taxes on this money. \$3000-\$0= the full \$3000 goes to charities
- 3. Yes, if she wanted to donate only \$2000, she could have \$1000 (\$680 after taxes) sent to her.
- 4. Also, she can request the money be distributed among several charities.

### These donations are called **Qualified Charitable Deductions (QCD's)**.

All it takes is a phone call to the custodian of your IRA (or your accountant/financial advisor). They can help you set up the process and timing for sending out your QCD checks this year.




