SESSION SYNOPSIS OF MAY 17, 2023

Baptism and Confirmation are two gifts from God and reason for celebration within our church family, and each provided a gratifying introduction to the May Session meeting.

First, Pastor Kim introduced Sarah Middleton, the daughter of Suk and Michael McKee, and Sarah's husband Tyler, who are requesting that their daughter Aria be baptized at First Presbyterian. Sarah shared some of her story about her journey as a baptized and confirmed Presbyterian herself. After questions and meaningful conversation, a motion was made and unanimously approved to celebrate the baptism of Aria Middleton on July 9, 2023.

Second, Pastor Ken introduced Noelle Kukler who has grown up in this church and has participated in the two-year confirmation program taught by Pastor Ken and Heather Crews. Noelle shared her statement of faith with the Elders and answered their questions after which a motion was made and also unanimously approved to welcome Noelle into membership. She shared her statement of faith with the congregation and was officially confirmed during worship on Sunday, May 21, followed by the delicious Confirmation Potluck Luncheon.

We are truly blessed to have added Noelle to our church family now and look forward to welcoming Aria in July.

In other business, several **motions** were **approved**:

- The June Session meeting has been rescheduled for June 14, 2023.
- Finance Team has recommended the Treasurer cash in a CD invested with PILP (Presbyterian Investment & Loan Program) coming due in May, transfer a previously approved match for Smock Grant to capital account, and invest remainder in high-interest CD with Horizon Bank.
- Finance Team has recommended that the newly renamed Planned Giving Team become a subcommittee of the Finance Team, including endowment giving as part of their expertise.
- ➤ Vacation Bible Camp will collect a missional offering from June 4, 2023, through June 28, 2023, to support The Caring Place and World Relief (a Christian-based non-profit that does refugee resettlement work, including Ukrainian families in the Chicagoland area).

Elders are continuing to work on a new document covering use of our facilities; beginning to work on calling candidates for Elder and Deacon positions; and beginning to plan for the fall Stewardship campaign.

Reports were received from the Treasurer, the Clerk, Pastor Kim, Building & Grounds, Congregational Life, Faith Formation, Worship, and the Presbyterian Resale Shop. In addition, four members of the Presbyterian Resale Shop attended the meeting asking questions regarding the upcoming church audit. While some of their questions were answered, they were directed to meet with the Administrative Commission that has been delegated with resolving any issues they might have.



What Students Are Saying About Race and Racism in America New York Times March 2021

The New York Times invited teenagers across the nation to join a moderated discussion about racial equity and justice. The article offers a sampling of the 2,000-plus thoughtful, passionate comments. Here are two of those comments:

I feel that there is no real definite solution to racism, but there are steps that can be taken to get closer to equality. Step 1 would be to teach your kids how to show compassion and how not to judge someone by the color of their skin but by the content of their character. By doing this, the next generation will grow up knowing how to not judge others by the way that they look but by the way they act and the decisions they make. Step 2 would be to educate this generation and the next about racism and the correct history behind it. It is mostly ignorance that causes people to make poor judgment on others and treat others unfairly and that is what I believe is one of the main causes of racism. Step 3 would be to enforce the change of history books and to encourage communities to work for each other not against each other.

I am white, and I live in a predominately white suburban town. I have never been treated differently for the color of my skin because I am a product of white privilege. I was not very politically active until George Floyd was murdered and the Black Lives Matter protests began in May. Since then, I've tried to better understand the hardships that people of color endure as a result of racism. I think it is of the utmost importance to speak out against corrupt systems, especially if you are not affected by these systems. Because in my opinion, choosing not to speak up against something because it does not involve you is proof that the system is working. Turning a blind eye with the thinly veiled excuse "politics isn't for me" can no longer mask selfish ignorance. This is not the time to be anti-political because silence is contributing to the blatant discrimination of black Americans. Hiding behind privilege instead of utilizing that very privilege to initiate change can no longer be justified.

FINANCE TEAM NEWS

FINANCE TEAM REPORT HIGHLIGHTS AS OF APRIL 30, 2023

- \$18,868 was received in April from our Endowment and legacy gifts through Porter County Community Foundation, designated to funds for scholarships, our operating expenses, music and unbudgeted mission and ministry needs this year. If you want to consider these kinds of gifts, see our Planned Giving materials.
- \$218,165.23 has been received as pledged so far this year, just under half way to our operating fund pledge goal for the year. We received another \$14,647 in general support for our budget.
- \$9,368 from our mission giving and \$20,000 through the Presbyterian Women Resale Shop has been sent to community and world-wide missions.
- Our preschool is self-sustaining, we receive extra gifts to support our varied musicians, and our ministry teams are keeping within their budgets as they do their work on our behalf.
- Overall income for April was \$57,941.78; year-to-date is \$305,922.
- Overall expenses for April were \$48,300 and year-to-date is \$237,864.
- Watch this summer for \$70,000 in updates to our building for water fountains, some required repairs, and modifications to improve access for those with mobility limits paid for by a Smock Foundation grant and gifts to our capital fund.

Numbers like these demonstrate the deep commitment of our congregation to support our current mission and ministries – intergenerational Faith Formation, rich spectrum of music in our worship, our generosity to serve others through missions, and our pastors and staff, technology, utilities, etc. that support all that we do in ministry. We are doing so much right now, building closer personal relationships as we work together post-pandemic. Just imagine what we can do through *The Sharing Table Project for tomorrow!*
