## Session Synopsis of February 18, 2019

Eight elders on Session joined the moderator and clerk pro tem at 7 pm on Monday, February 18<sup>th</sup>. Parish Associate and appointed Moderator Rev. Nancy Becker moderated the meeting in which Session:

- Began with devotions on Presidents' Day led by Jerry Kahrs that focused on "the greatest American story ever told," i.e. Lincoln's courage to end the sale and ownership of human beings by doing "the right thing," though he surely knew it would come initially with great cost. His action came after the death of his son and Lincoln's search for his relationship with God that he found through Presbyterian pastors in Springfield and New York City. Jerry led prayers for those grieving loss and living with sorrow to surrender to deeper reliance on God.
- > Approved recommendation from Building and Grounds Team to have the church doors rekeyed and locks replaced due to wear that can no longer be repaired and some 200 outstanding keys distributed over many years.
- Approved joint recommendation from Personnel and Finance Teams to grant an additional \$300 per month as a stipend toward health insurance for the Director of Christian Education.
- Informally agreed to the request of the Pastoral Nominating Committee for a called session meeting concerning the proposed Ministry Information Form sometime during the next ten days in order to get our information considered by the presbytery committee at its meeting the first week in March.
- Granted provisional approval for Scout Troop 920's request to use our building for a fundraiser on April 12, 4 pm to 7 pm, so that they can plan appropriately, if in fact they are a chartered troop, they take responsibility for clean up, and there is no conflict with church events scheduled on that day. Moderator read an inconsistent letter to session indicating that Scout Troop 920 was no longer chartered and that there was a group of seven girls meeting as the troop. Moderator will clarify their status on behalf of session.
- Referred a seminary student's request for financial support for three summer months during his clinical pastoral education program to the Finance Team for its recommendation for source of funding and consistency with any relevant policies.
- > Heard a report concerning the Presbytery Assembly held on February 16, 2019, and received other reports from Christian Education, Mission, Worship, Building and Grounds and Finance Teams, as well as Membership Clerk. Session approved its meeting minutes.

Adjourned at 7:42 with prayers led by Parish Associate Nancy Becker for those in need of healing.

<u>The committee consists of</u>: Jim Hubbard & Vic Klancer, Co-moderators; Julie Fletcher-Golding, Secretary; Jason Gordon; Kathy Joseph; Linda Long; Lisa Pavlopoulos, Session Rep; Ron Izynski; Tracy Campbell; and Wendy Banta-Long.

Committee was elected February 3, had its initial meeting that day and has subsequently been working hard to put all things necessary to call a new pastor in place in a timely fashion.

Because of the good work of the last PNC that found Pastor Mark Mueller and the good job they did with the church profile (Ministry Information Form or MIF), this time around we need only update that profile and that has been the work the committee has been about since 2.3.19.

<u>Timeline</u>: Complete the update of the MIF and get Session approval by 2.28.19; submit the Session-approved MIF to Presbytery's Commission on Ministry (COM) for its 3.7.19 meeting; if approved, then we can submit to the PCUSA Louisville, KY headquarters, get approval and be allowed to then enter our church's profile and our opening for a Pastor Head of Staff into the Church Leadership Connection (CLC) system. The CLC is the PCUSA's online system where pastor candidates seeking a call from a church can review all the open pastoral positions across the nation and can submit their resume for consideration. Our Presbytery will review all submissions first and then pass those that are a good match on to our PNC for review and consideration. (This is the where the hard work of a PNC really begins.)

The PNC will provide updates as it proceeds along this timeline. Your prayers and support are appreciated.


