SESSION SYNOPSIS OF MARCH 20, 2024

The March Session Meeting was held one week earlier than normal to avoid meeting during Holy Week. The initial part of the meeting was what is known as Elder Training when the elders were provided some information and/or materials in advance that are then discussed during this time of the meeting. This month our Associate Pastor in Residence, Julia Qiuye Zhao 趙秋葉 led a lively and insightful discussion that started with the elders reading Pastor Julia's article written for the Center of Asian American Christianity at Princeton Theological Seminary that had previously been shared with the Wednesday morning Bible Study group at our church. It was a way to get to know Pastor Julia better and to discuss how a person's name is so intertwined with who they are and how they are viewed by others. Discussion involved instances in history where an immigrant's name was changed for a variety of reasons. Examples included name changes like Abram & Sarai to Abraham & Sarah as a sign of the covenant with God, changed names of European immigrants upon arriving at Ellis Island in America to make them more "American," or easier to pronounce, etc. Several Elders spoke of changes in their family names. In Julia's case upon her arrival in Canada at age nine her name was determined to be 'unpronounceable' to English speakers and she was advised to use an English name. What that meant to her to have a new name other than what she was called at birth and how her situation has been mirrored by other immigrants when their names are changed led to a very insightful conversation. Being a welcoming congregation requires that we listen and learn a person's name, and to also appreciate, the importance of a person's name.

ACTIONS TAKEN BY SESSION

During the normal course of the meeting, several MOTIONS were presented to Session from several Teams the key ones being:

MOTION to Session from Worship Team for Summer Worship Schedule beginning in May 2024 with outdoor worship scheduled to be the 1st & 3rd Sundays of the month, pending weather, concluding at the end of September. This will be the same annually going forward. APPROVED.

MOTION to Session from the Finance Team to accept the recommendation of the Planned Giving Committee that FPCV accept all funds available from our investments with the Porter County Community Foundation: \$5,450 from the Breyding Fund, \$1,000 from the Graeber Fund and \$12,716 from FPCV Endowment investment was seconded and APPROVED.

MOTION to Session from the Bylaws Task Force to approve the submitted version of the Facilities Use Policies & Fees for implementation April 1st with the revisions to the policy to reflect how situations where there are questions as to eligibility will be handled. A second was made and motion APPROVED. *(Copies of this policy are available by request to Office Administrator Dawn Scarborough.)*

MOTIONS from Mission Team to Session to (a) Accept resignation of Cindy Robinson as Co-Moderator and b) to approve appointment of long-time Resale Shop volunteer Sue Durnell as Co-Moderator. APPROVED

MOTION to Session with a second that any leftover items from the Bake Sale on Saturday, November 2, 2024, be sold in the Hospitality Center before and after the church service on Sunday November 3, 2024. APPROVED

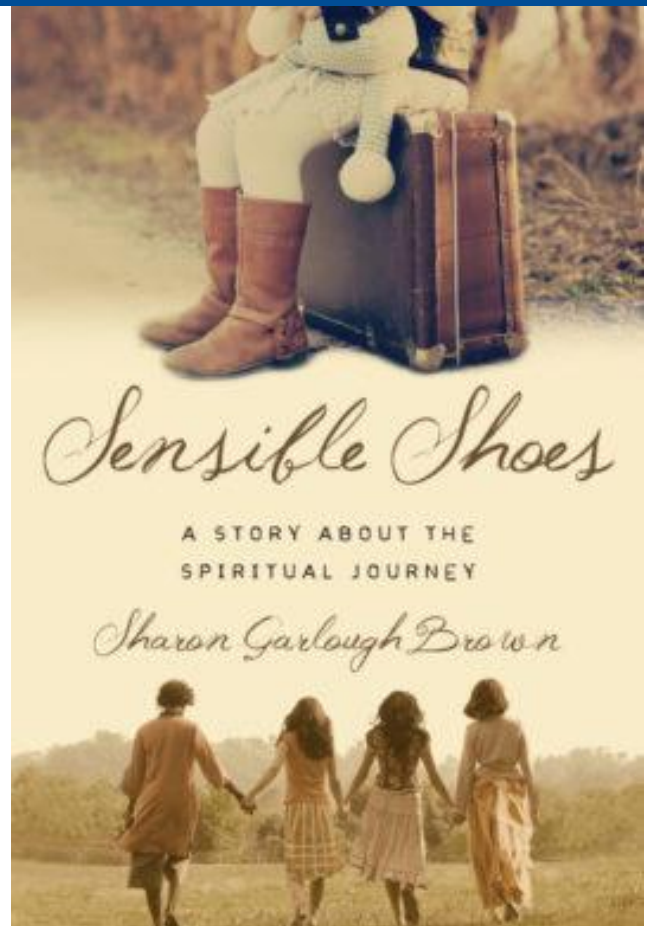

PLANNED GIVING: HELPING FIRST PRESBYTERIAN GO ABOVE AND BEYOND

Most of us understand the importance of committing a portion of our annual income to our church and recognize our annual giving is what we are called to return to God. We know those dollars support the *very existence* of our faith community including our fundamental ability to serve each other and those beyond our walls.

Unlike our Annual (Stewardship) giving, Planned Gifts (*Special* or *Legacy Gifts*), generally given from accumulated assets, are over and above our regular annual giving and require us to decide on the best financial way to make such a gift along with how we wish for it to be used. If thoughtfully structured, a charitable Planned Gift can even help reduce our taxes.

Historically, Planned Gifts have played a critical role in supporting churches throughout the country. Indeed, much of what churches have and are able to accomplish require such giving. In more recent decades, however, an increasing number of worthy organizations have been competing for these dollars making it difficult for churches to rely on their continued flow, and yet.....*receiving Planned Gifts remains essential.*

Throughout First Presbyterian's history we too have been blessed by these types of gifts. The brief listing below **provides a sampling of gifts** received during the last two decades.

- 1) Several *undesignated* gifts (given without requirements for their use) were directed by Session to:
 - ◆ the purchase of sanctuary chairs that replaced worn, broken pews;
 - ◆ the purchase of hand bells that created a new music ministry;
 - ◆ a set aside for building emergencies; and
 - ◆ new equipment that made it possible to construct a successful live stream and stay connected as a congregation during the pandemic.
- 2) Gifts *designated by donors* for a specific purpose have provided our faith community with:
 - ◆ a beautiful outdoor worship and gathering pavilion;
 - ◆ a children's playground for children of members and friends as well as preschool children;
 - ◆ a chancel suite of handcrafted furniture for our communal sacred worship;
 - ◆ the ability to support several mission efforts; and
 - ◆ a fully paid off mortgage, freeing operating dollars for other essentials.
- 3) Finally, gifts *designated to the Church Endowment* (which conserves principal) have returned almost \$90,000 dollars to First Presbyterian since 2016 and have supported:
 - ◆ scholarships;
 - ◆ our music ministry;
 - ◆ mission and ministry projects including the Carrie Newcomer concert with all concert proceeds donated to the Caring Place; and
 - ◆ church operating expenses.

Truly, so much of what First Presbyterian has, uses or gives away comes from gifts that go beyond our annual giving. It is because of this reality and the abiding belief that First Presbyterian is a necessary and valuable presence in Valparaiso, that your Planned Giving Team asks you to prayerfully consider your faith community when you create an estate plan or when you simply wish to make a special charitable gift at any time.
