

According to author Charles Swindoll, "January marks the beginning of the season of reverence."

Dear Friends,

We are writing to you during this very busy time of year to inform and/or update you on a matter of considerable importance regarding our sanctuary.

Many of us have seen or read that our church building has two main pillars in the sanctuary that are in need of major repairs to properly support the roof. The laminated wooden pillars were sheathed with metal when they were installed and it was a surprise to find them deteriorating and sinking due to hidden and undetected water damage over the years.

While there is no immediate danger, it is essential that these pillars be repaired as quickly as possible. To that end, the Building and Grounds Team have already engaged a structural engineer and an architect to implement temporary measures to stabilize the columns and to plan the required permanent structural repairs. The preliminary estimate for both temporary and more permanent remedial work is approximately \$80,000, but it should be stated that the total could be significantly more (or less).

Your Finance Ministry Team has considered how best to fund these needed repairs to our worship space and would like to share the following:

- First, members and friends of First Presbyterian Church are invited to make special gifts this season dedicated to "Column Repairs." Buildings are secondary to worshiping our God, hearing the Word, and spreading news of the Christ Child by words and actions, but we are also reminded that in their hour of need, Mary and Joseph were provided shelter even though "there was no place for them in the inn."
- Secondly, due to the ongoing generosity of our congregation and careful stewardship of our money, we have accumulated some residual operating funds which can be applied to the cost of structural repairs not covered by special gifts. It is our hope that it will not be necessary to entirely deplete these residual operating funds as they are held in reserve to address a variety of unanticipated special needs.
- Finally, there is approximately \$5,600 remaining in the Capital Fund which will be applied toward the repair bill.

As we approach the end of the year, you may be considering making charitable donations to support the needs of the community in a variety of ways. We are encouraging you to consider including FPC Valpo in your plans and investing in your worship space by making a dedicated gift to the "Column Repairs" fund.

Thanks so very much for your generosity this year and may God's blessings be yours this Christmas!

## Malawi Matters, Inc. News

#### Malawi Matters Inc. Update on Motorcycle Campaign

#### Thanks

Thanks to you, the numbers are starting to add up! We're grateful for your contribution to Malawi Matters' campaign "9 Bikes (motorcycles) for 9 Guys (Volunteer Field Workers in the Central Region of the country)". This email is solely to give you an update on our fantastic progress.

#### **Funds**

To date, \$28,177.72 has been raised: \$19,727.72 in donations and \$8,450.00 contributed by the nine guys. In addition, \$2,455.80 is still pledged by individuals and \$1,900.00 is pledged by the remaining four RRs.

#### Bikes - Purchased

At this point, two bikes have been obtained (Yoweri and James) and three more will be purchased this week – actually Friday (Franklin, Alfred, Kennedy).

#### Costs

In October, we were told of a price increase of \$123.82 per bike (which is understandable as the initial quotation came in March). In November, upon purchase of the first two vehicles, the Malawi Revenue Authority imposed duty of \$998.94 on each bike (even though our quote was duty free). We have appealed but it will not be rescinded. Thus, the cost of each bike is \$5,694.29 (\$5,700.00) not \$4,600.00 as we were figuring when we began the campaign.

#### What's Next?

First, we've asked each RR to pay the additional  $1/4^{th}$  of the actual price of the bike - \$275.00 per person for a total of \$2,475.00. Once the pledges listed above, plus this amount, are paid we will have funds for bike six and a start on bike seven.

We will NOT be doing a public campaign about this again, but people are encouraged to keep spreading the word. We will continue to post totals in our newsletters and on social media. As noted in our fall appeal brochure our fundraising efforts are focused on expansion of MMI programs to 2,000 schools! We know we'll reach the bike goal, but the increased costs have been a bump along the road!

#### The Training

Malawi Matters has raised an additional \$2,000 for the ten-day training course for the nine guys (plus David and the two instructors from the driving school). It will be conducted during the holiday break (as many of these men are teachers and have jobs besides the work they do in the villages for MMI).

# Israel/Palestine/Jordan Mission-Vision Trip

Join Associate Director Marilyn Borst and visit Outreach's strategic partners: Bethlehem Bible College, Palestinian Bible Society and Musalaha (a reconciliation ministry) to learn of their work and witness. We will also meet with other Palestinian Christian ministries to learn how they are seeking to be faithful under pressure and with peace, a seemingly elusive ideal in this controversial but compelling place.



There will, of course, be ample time to experience the sites of the Biblical narrative and the places where Christ's life and ministry became incarnational, including the Jerusalem area, Bethlehem, Nazareth and the Galilee, as well as Jericho and the Dead Sea. Participants will be expected to absorb assigned readings which will help prepare them to explore the history and politics of a contested land and to wrestle with the often-distorted theologies which have skewed our understanding of what the Bible teaches us about that land and the divine covenants (in both the Old and New Testaments) which were formed in that crucible.



We will also spend some days in Jordan visiting the refugee ministries of Middle East Council of Churches, who, through their Orthodox Initiative, are bringing hope and healing to both Syrian and Iraqi refugees. We will spend time with the students and staff of the Holy Land Institute for the Deaf where, for 50 years, this Anglican boarding school has dispensed both loving care and quality education. There will be an add-on option to see Petra.
